## ESPHS ANNUAL MEETING AT ROPEX 2012, ROCHESTER, NY SATURDAY, MAY 19<sup>TH</sup> TRADING HOUR NOON TO 1 PM FOLLOWED IMMEDIATELY BY THE ANNUAL MEETING

The 2012 Empire State Postal History Society annual meeting will be held at ROPEX 2012, the Rochester Philatelic Association's annual national stamp show, The Sports Centre at MCC, 2700 Brighton Henrietta Townline Road on the campus of Monroe Community College, south of the City of Rochester.

ROPEX is a three-day show, May 18 - 20; hours are  $11^{AM}$  to  $6^{PM}$  on Friday, 10 to 5 on Saturday and 10 to 3 on Sunday. Parking is free and adult admission is \$3 per day (kids admitted free). Both the building and the show itself are Handicap Accessible.

Society members attending ROPEX 2012 on <u>Saturday</u> are encouraged to attend the traditional ESPHS discussion, trading and lunch hour beginning at <u>12 noon</u> in Meeting Room #1 (upper level). Bring your own lunch, covers and other items for discussion. Guests are welcome. The membership's annual meeting will be held from  $\frac{1}{1}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  also in Meeting Room #1, and will include reports by Society officers and the election of officers and directors.

For those traveling from the north on I-390, take exit 15B. For those coming from the Thruway or points south on I-390, take exit 14 and turn left at the off-ramp light. Continue past Jefferson Road, the Shopping Center on the right, the Brighton-Henrietta Town Line Road on-ramp at a light and then take the entrance on the right into the Monroe Community College campus. Take a right turn onto the road that loops to the back of the campus, where The Sports Centre is located.

Since ROPEX offers ESPHS its best opportunity to recruit new members, the Society will have a table at the show. Members who can spend time at this table are asked to contact David Przepiora at **djprze@hotmail.com**, with dates and times they can help.

#### **SOCIETY LOSES THREE MEMBERS**

Long time ESPHS member **Jerry A. Kotek** passed away on October 31, 2011 in his home town of York, Pa. according to his daughter, who wrote to advise the Society of his death.

As a young man, Jerry was a good enough bowler to consider becoming a professional. Instead, he was drafted into the Army and served during the Korean war as a communications specialist. After his Army service, Jerry graduated from Farleigh Dickinson University with a degree in industrial engineering. Jerry and his wife Florence moved to York in 1963 when Jerry went to work for York Borg-Warner and experienced a long career.

Jerry had a passion for stamp and post card collecting. He was an active volunteer in the White Rose Philatelic Society and shared his stamp collecting enthusiasm with the Colonial York Junior Stamp Club. He was a founding member of the York Post Card Club and had a life long interest in the stamps of Czechoslovakia, where his parents were born.

We have just received word that **John A. Lange, Jr.** died on February  $6^{th}$ , in the fullness of his years. John has been a member of ESPHS since 1969. I can only imagine the contributions he made to philately, postal history and stamp clubs in his lifetime since I never met John face to face and I have been a member only five years.

I can say, however, that as soon as I joined ESPHS and announced my interest in the postal history of Schenectady, John was Johnny-on-the-Spot with encouragement and insights from his years of specializing in neighboring Saratoga. When I started contributing to our journal, he always sent me an "atta boy". When I took on editorship of *Bulletin* he was one of the first to write a note thanking me and saying he was sure I'd do a good job (see what courage he had?). When we brought auctions back as a regular feature in full color, John consigned to every auction – all of his lots sold in Auction 3, which closed on the 15<sup>th</sup> – giving me yet another important level of support.

I'm sure that other members will remember John in their own, fuller, context, but I will miss John very much.

**William C. Sheetz** of Newark, N. Y., passed away on August 15, 2011. He was 96 years old. Mr. Sheetz was a long-time member of Empire State Postal History Society and also a member for 55 years of the American Philatelic Society. He was a member of the Western New York Postcard Club, the Finger Lakes Stamp Club and was a past president of the Wayne County Antique Dealers Association.

Although a stamp collector for many years, he later collected the postal history of Wayne County and portions of Ontario County. He and his wife, Carol, operated an antique store in the area and enjoyed summers in their cottage on Sodus Bay.

Bill served in Co. L, 348<sup>th</sup> Regiment, 100<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division during World War II and was awarded two Bronze Stars during that conflict.

Bill was a good friend and fellow collector of New York State postal history who will be greatly missed.
