6th SUPPLEMENT TO NYS MAN-U-SCRIPT POSTMARKS

Manuscript Post Offices of New York State, first published by your society in 1972, has had three formal editions and one master supplement. Since 1984, Doug Penwell has labored as researcher for and editor of new discoveries to improve the content of that seminal resource for collectors of New York State postal history.

Together with this issue of *Bulletin* we are pleased to send you the latest Supplement to the title - again with thanks for Doug.

1984 was the year that Lee De Graff's work was incorporated into Henry Chlanda and Chester Wilcox's 54 page Third Edition. This was followed by a few occasional Supplements, capped in 1999 by a Master Supplement (now out of print). Doug and ESPHS both expect formalization of the information gathered from time to time into a Fourth Edition of *Manuscript Post Offices of New York State*. In this 4th edition, Doug will continue to refine distinctions in nomenclature such as "Free" franking versus "Free" rating. Doug also recognizes that there are some open issues for which he seeks input from members. These are put forth in his introductory page to the 6th Supplement.

Doug makes one final point: We, as collectors, probably all have one manuscript cover that contains information not yet captured despite all the work done by collectors, editors and publishers to date. The best way to eliminate the need for a 7th Supplement any time soon is to contact Doug Penwell (dougpenwell@mail.com). He will appreciate hearing from you.
