From Cadet to Admiral



The cover illustrated nearby sat in my collection for many years before I rediscovered it and did some research on the net. Frank H. Schofield was born January 4, 1869 in Jerusalem, Yates Co., N.Y. He was appointed to the Naval Academy in 1886. He completed the course four years later, served the two years at sea which was then required by law before final graduation, and was commissioned Ensign in the U.S. Navy in July 1892.

After graduation, he served aboard several cruisers and for a time, Inspector of Ordnance at Hartford, Conn. He served onboard the USS Hawk during the Spanish-American War, participating in the blockade of Cuban ports and in the capture of four enemy vessels. During the period from 1898 until the U.S. entered WW I in 1917, he served aboard several other vessels and two years in the then Bureau of Ordnance.

In the rank of Capt., he was ordered in 1917 to London, England, where he served as Aide in the Planning Section to the Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Operating in European Waters. He was awarded the Navy Cross, and many decoration by foreign governments for his service.

He attained the rank of Rear Admiral in 1924. In 1928, Admiral Schofield was ordered to form and head a board to recommend a method of obtaining certain oceanographic data. This Board, later known as the Schofield Board, submitted recommendations that the Navy undertake oceanographic survey work on the high seas with its own specially outfitted vessels.

In 1924, he became Commander Battleship Division Four with the rank of full Admiral He retired in 1933 after forty-seven years on Naval Service.

Admiral Schofield died on February 20, 1942 and was buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

The USS Schofield (DEG-

3, later FFG-3) was com-missioned May 11, 1968. She served her entire career in the Pacific with many tours in Vietnamese waters. USS Schofield was decommissioned on Sept. 8, 1988 and was sunk during target practice on November 2, 1999.
