Appended is the hotel list of your town as published by us last year. Will you kindly cross out any resorts which have gone out of business and make any other corrections or additions which you know of?

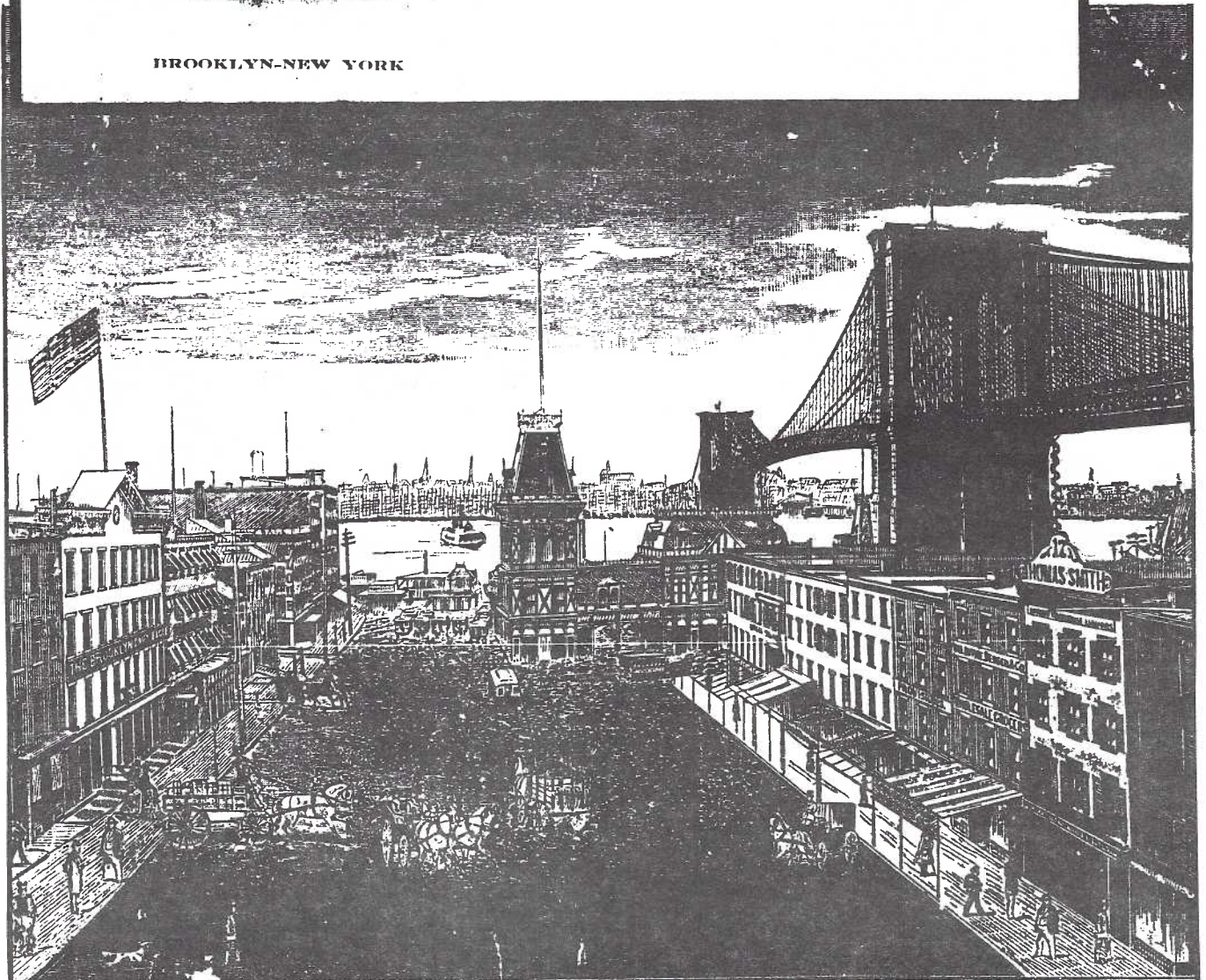
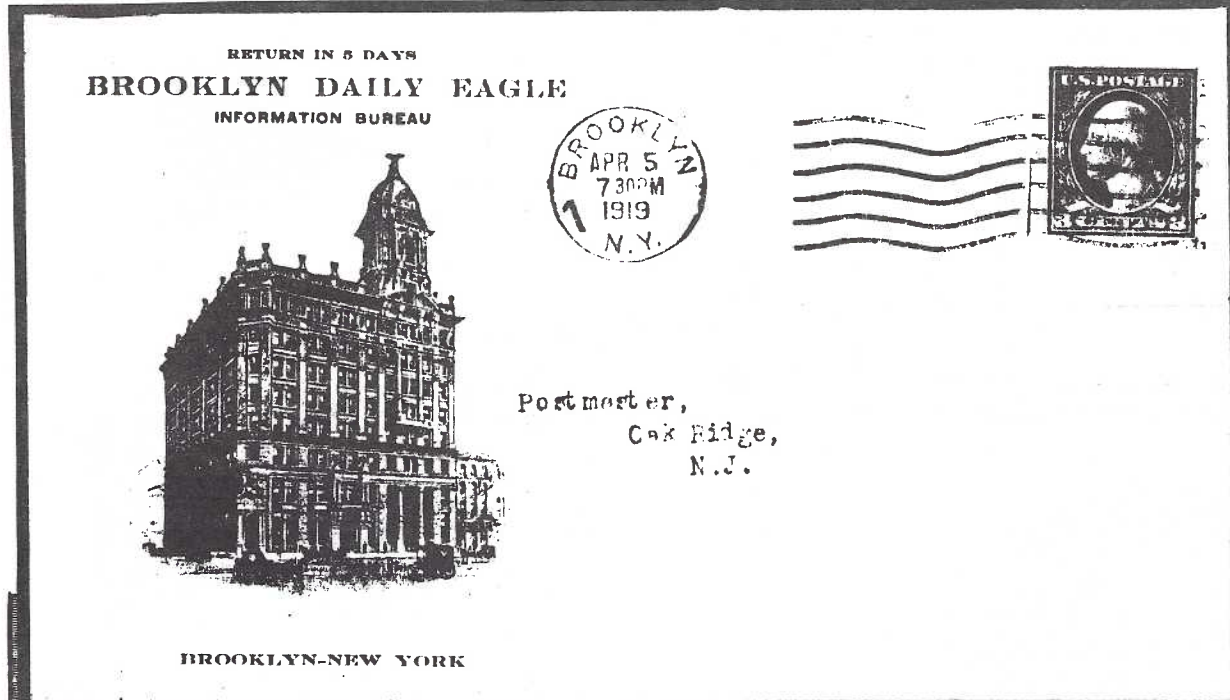

## Not letter perfect, but better

### Out of last place in mail delivery

Long in last place in the nation's ranking of on-time mail delivery, Long Island's postal service has nudged itself out of the basement.

Latest figures from a U.S. Postal Service quarterly survey show first-class mail in Nassau and Suffolk was delivered on time 76% of the time — up from a previous on-time rate of 70%, which had Long Island last in the nation in efficiency.

"We are pleased with the progress being reported," said U.S. Rep. Gary Ackerman (D-Nassau-Queens).

"The local postmasters worked with us on this to improve overall service for postal patrons on Long Island," said Dan Michaelis, aid to U.S. Rep. Peter King (R-Seaford).

Outraged over the previous last-place standing, the congressional group met with postal officials in May to demand improvement.

Responding to demands from U.S. Sen. Alfonse D'Amato, U.S. Postmaster General Marvin Runyon outlined a series of actions to improve postal service on Long Island, as well as in Westchester and New York City.

Steps toward improvement on Long Island included:

- Expansion of the mail processing plants in Melville and Garden City.

- Creation of postal teams to improve accuracy and timeliness.

- Hiring 150 additional letter carriers and 50 additional clerks.

- Better communications within the Long Island postal system, and increased outreach to customers, including extending window service hours at 14 post offices and offering 24-hour retail service at Hicksville on weekdays.

Delegation members said the statistical upturn in performance could be traced to the promised improvements.

Since the Postal Service began ranking on-time service three years ago, Long Island has consistently ranked near the bottom of the list.

In 1990, Long Island was second-to-last with an on-time rate of 67%.

#### Dead last earlier this year

Earlier this year the Island was dead last.

Now, with Long Island's apparent improvement, eight major postal areas have worse on-time ratings including last-place San Juan (62%), Baltimore (69%) and Lancaster, Pa. (72%).

Who's first?

Des Moines, with a 91% rating — proving the old saying that rain or snow or even a hundred-year flood can't stop the mail.

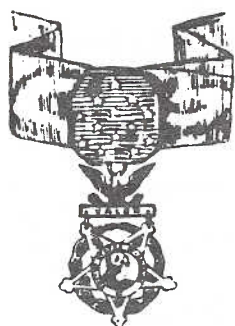

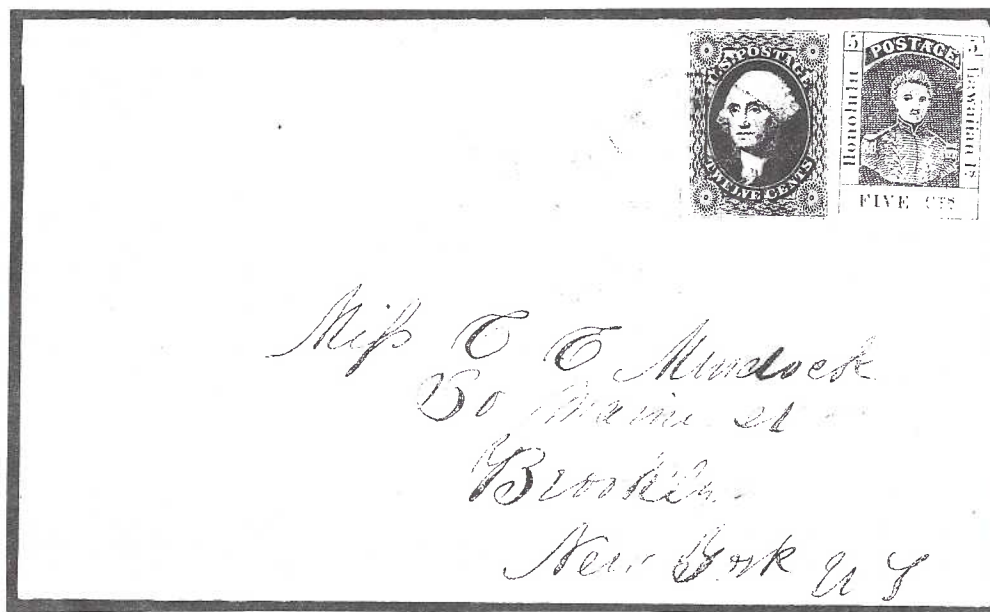

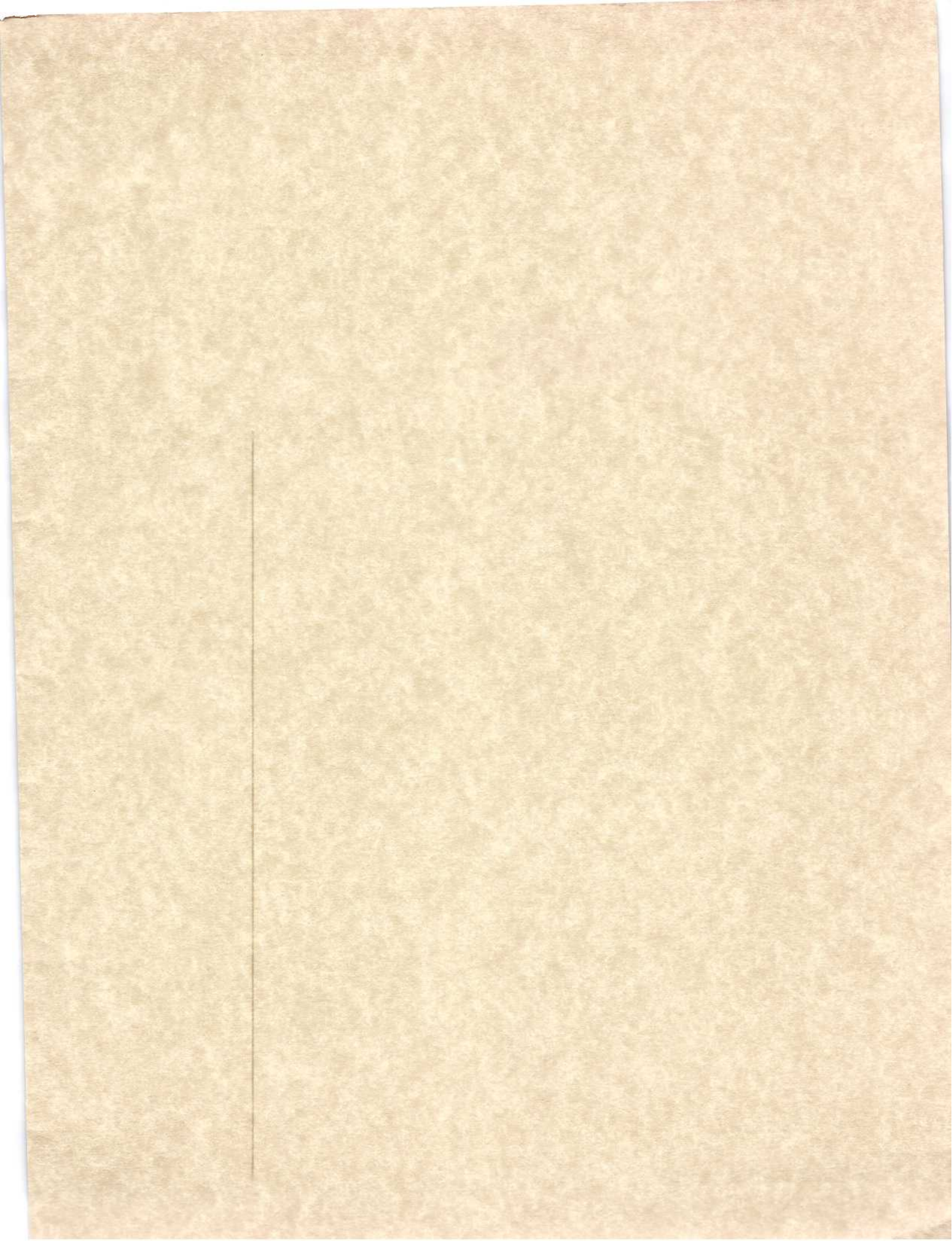
