CREAM STREET-CAMPTON: TWO P.O.'s, ONE PLACE by: Roy Aniquist


President Franklin D Roosevelt had hoped to retire to his "Dream House." The "Dream House" was built on the eastern portion of the property which also took in Vallkil, the house which was to be made famous by Eleanor Roosevelt. The most commonly known entrance to these houses is from Route 9G. Less commonly known is that there was a back entrance to the "Dream House" from Cream Street. This entrance is no longer there as Roosevelt's house was removed, and a part of the property was sold. Today there is only the former entrance to the Vallkil property.

That back entrance is perhaps as close to fame that rural road ever came. For over a century it saw farmers and their wagons, and then briefly, it saw the famous and the royal, and the royally famous. Today it is a residential street still quite rural. The people who lived along Cream Street once were serviced by a post office under the names Creamstreet, Cream Street, and Campton. However, this ended some forty years before the "Dream House".

The Post office, which was established in 1883, serviced residents along the four mile stretch of Cream Street. At most, there may have been a hamlet but there is nothing to indicate any larger population concentration. Though listed in both the 1880 census and the 1900 census, no population figures are given for Cream Street. The only indication of population is found in the report of John Campton filed with the Postal Survey Department in which he gives the figure seventy. Seemingly, this is more the history of a street than a community.

The date of Cream Street being established is uncertain. Prior to 1810, the name is not recorded in any deed, mortgage or estate of the county. (1) By 1829, a straight road is shown on the Burr map, and by mid 1850's a "Y" is shown to Quaker Lane, and Dutchess Hill connects it to Route 9G, then known as Creek Road (later Violet Avenue).

Attempting to put the pieces together, it is known that the last link of Creek Road was completed in 1801, and, at the same time, it was proposed to improve the Salt Point Road. Shortly thereafter, Salt Point Road became a turnpike which angered farmers who resented having to pay for the use of a road. Also, this is the period of the sailing ship which tends to end circa 1830 (Carmer, The Hudson) As a result, the traffic was generally from the east going west, or from the farms of Dutchess County and Connecticut to the Hudson River where the goods would be carried to the City of New York, or some foreign Country.

With these facts in mind, it seems reasonable that Cream Street became a regularly traveled route soon after the establishment of the Salt Point Turnpike. Farmers would come in along Netherwood Road. If they were to turn left on Quaker Lane, they would come into the tollroad. If they were to continue into Union Corners, they could avoid the turnpike, but it would take two or more additional hours of travel at the six miles per hour rate of the day. On the other hand, a turn at a

The following article appeared in the Geneva Gazette, November 1, 1872.

POST OFFICE MANAGEMENT IN CONGRESSMAN LAMPORT'S DISTRICT

Lima. NY Oct 28, 1872

Eds. U. & A.: If the public knew much about the workings of the Post Offices of the Congressional District as your Representative, perhaps they would think as he does about the Post at Mt. Morris in opening a Master letter and answering it being an act "too thin" (compared to others) to reguire attention . It is a well known fact here, and one that has caused considerable and private denunciation, that it is almost an impossibility to get a letter through the mails that is written in the interest of the Liberal or Democratic cause. Letters containing money too often go astray and never reach their destination, and letters that do go through are often tampered A complaint was made at headquarters some time since by one of our citizens charging that a letter he had written and mailed had been taken from the office, opened, copied and then fowarded. He was informed that an officer would be here and investigate the charge. After months of delay he is informed by letter from a detective that he (the detective) was at Lima while the complainant "was out riding" and assured that hereafter his letters will not be interfered with. But further developments will show that this is not all the complaint requires, and the citizens in general feel that they have some rights that should be respected even by those that work so zealously for Grant. Hence look for a favorable vote from Lima for the honest and capable Wm. M. White, who will be next Congressman, and a rebuke to the one misrepresenting us, who goes about the district delivering a speach that some one has prepared for him. that contains more lies than is profitable to repeat, and threatening to smooth down his son's grave in case of which creates some sympathy for the bones of the son but none for the father.

road in the area of Cream Street, and a feeder as Dutchess Hill, would take them into Poughkeepsie faster by at least two hours, and they would have avoided the toll roads. A partial corroboration is found in the unsubstantiated belief that Cream Street derived its name from the many milk wagons which passed over this road.

THE WINNE POST OFFICE

On February 19, 1873, Nicholas. Winne of Cream Street filed a report with the Topographer's office of the Post Office Department (2) in which he indicates the location of the proposed post office. (The year date of the report is not clear, but 1873 is assumed) On September 17, 1873, the appointment is effective and the Cream Street Post Office is established.

The location of the Winne Post Office was one and one-half miles into Cream Street from the East Park Road, and it was located on the west side of the road. The Beers map of 1867 shows a house for N. Winne, and the report he filed states that the location was 3 1/2 miles from the East Park Office, and that the carrier would have to make a turn at Green's Mills.

The turn at Green's Mills required a change in the mail delivery as previously the carrier went from East Park straight out East Park Road (This road is also Netherwood as of some indefinite point.)

Green's Mills no longer exists. In fact. members of the local historical society know nothing of the existence of these mills; however, earlier residents of the area do refer to the pond in this location as Penny Green's Pond. None of the people who use this name seem to know why, and several were born about the turn of the century. This is an interesting aside.

Two other noteworthy observations appear on this form. At the top there is a penned notation which reads "Recommended by Gail Ketcham." At the moment there is no significance to this name other than Ketcham is a common name in the county. Where the proposed name for the post office was written in as "Cream Street," there is a line through the name, and "Creamstreet" is penned in. This is a number of years before this change was mandated, and it raises the question as to wether this was the name used throughout, that is as one word. Does anyone have a cover with Cream Street as two words?

The Cream Street Post Office was discontinued November 9, 1885. The reason is not known to me.

THE MARSHALL POST OFFICE

Two weeks after the discontinuance of the Cream Street Post Office, it was once again reestablished with Charles Marshall as postmaster. His report is dated December 20, 1885, which leads me to believe that he re-established the post office in the original location. Shortly thereafter, he relocated to his house.

The Marshall location was probably at the point shown on the 1867 Beers map as H. B. Marshall, and that Charles was his son. However this is entirely speculation. The name Marshall is very common in the county but I have not been able to identify Charles Marshall. The location would then be just north of the Winne location and on the east side of the road. This would correspond with the topographer's report on which he noted the location as 3 miles from the East Park Office. However, he then struck this and entered Van Wagner as the closest post office.

Van Wagner was the second stop out of Poughkeepsie on the Boston and Poughkeepsie RR (Later Central New England among other names). This was also noted as the closest railroad with a mail stop.

THE MARQUET POST OFFICE

Griffen Marquet assumed the appointment of postmaster between 1885 and 1895. It is assumed that there were no other postmasters between Marshall and Marquet, but only because no other names have surfaced. The 1895 date is found in the Kay-Smith book as the time when it was mandated that the name be changed from Cream Street to one word, Creamstreet. At that time Griffen Marquet was postmaster, or so it is that I interpret Kay-Smith. It is not likely to be an appointment date.

As no report is filed, it must be assumed that the post office was operated in the same location as the Marshall Post Office.

During this period, the U. S. Post Office provided cancelling devices (\underline{C} . 1891) so that a hand device would have been in use at that time.

The post office was discontinued September 30 1896.

THE CAMPTON POST OFFICE

March. 1897, John Campton filed for the establishment of a post office to be located 4 miles from the East Park Post Office. The name was to be Campton. The request was approved and he received his appointment April 5, 1897.

The location of the post office would have been at the point just before Cream Street intersects with Compton Road (now Honeywell Lane), and Dutchess Hill. Further, it is probable that the post office was operated out of a general store. This building is still standing according to hearsay information, and it is a private residence today.

Unlike the other reports filed, John Campton drew a rough map which shows the location of the post office. This corresponds with the location above. Again this report is fowarded to either Henry Burnett, or John Campton.

THE PALMATEER POST OFFICE

The date that Charles Palmateer assumed the postmastership is April 26, 1899. It is likely that it was about the time he filed for a new site, February 8, 1899. It also appears that he filed a name change back to Cream Street, but this was denied as the name Campton remained.

The new location took the post office 4 1/2 miles from the East Park Post Office, or to the turn-off onto Honeywell Lane (Compton Road). The contract bid book notes the distance as 5.12 miles. The post office remained in operation at this location until April 14, 1903, when the post office was discontinued. Rural free delivery from Poughkeepsie made it unnecessary to have a post office at this location.

- (2) These reports seem to be filed in compliance with Section 527 of the March 3, 1879, Postal Laws and Regulations which stated that no post office may be established, or relocated with out the consent of the Department. A similar regulation must have been included in the previos edition as well.
