

Recently, this writer aquired a very early Essex County stampless cover from Essex Court House dated May 16, 1804. According to Kay and Smith in New York Postal History: The Post Offices and First Postmasters from 1775 to 1980 (State College, Pa, 1982) post offices were established at Essex and Willsborough, NY in the late 1700's and very early 1800's. The listings are quoted:

ESSEX, Est: Je 1801, Disc: J1 31, 1806, First Postmaster: Theodorus Ross; T Ross declined and Henry Baynham appointed Dec 28, 1801.

ESSEX (12936), Est: Ag 1, 1806, First Postmaster: Henry Baynham, From: Willsborough.

WILLSBOROUGH, Est: Mr 1, 1799, Disc: Ag 1, 1806, First Postmaster: Daniel Ross, From: Willsborough (Cli), To: Essex.

WILLSBOROUGH, Est: Ag 23, 1806, Disc: Nv 23 1893, First Postmaster: Levi Higby, To: Willsboro

Thanks to fellow ESPHS member Chester Wilcox, a very interesting letter follows:

Efsex Court House 15th April 1803

Dear Sir:

The post office is re established at the place where it was formerly kept in Willsborough and I am appointed Post Master...

The name of this office was formerly Willsborough but it is now distinguished by the name of $\underline{\text{Efsex Court}}$ House it being situated near the Court House in this County.

Please there for to direct the letter etc. in future in this way \underline{to} wit (Efsex Court House New York)

I am your obedt & very humble sert.
 /s/ Theodorus Rofs

Pliney Moor Esquire

At least one other cover exists with the Essex Court House marking (Dec 21, 1803). All three covers are addressed to Pliney Moore, the first post master of Champlain, N.Y.

The following paraphrases information from a "Sketch of the History of the Town of Essex, N.Y." written by Henry Harmon Noble (Moorsfield Press, Champlain, N.Y., 1940)

LA POSTA was begun in 1969 by Richard Helbock, and focused mainly on West Coast postal history. A couple of years ago, LA POSTA was expanded to include a Railroad Section, edited by Charles Towle, and more recently, a Midwest Section, edited by Alan Patera. With the Oct-Nov 1984 edition, LA POSTA added an Eastern Section, edited by Robert J Stets, Sr, and will now provide, six times a year, 70 to 100 pages of original research data concerning postal history of the entire United States.

MANUSCRIPT POST OFFCIES OF NEW YORK STATE

Edited by members Henry Chlanda and Chester E wilcox, the publication is a definitive up-dating of the original work distributed in 1970 and revised in 1973. The 1984 edition is the long awaited culmination of fifteen years work recording on cards the data reported by many collectors and historians. Manuscript post office is the term used to describe the hand written office name and date placed on a letter at the point of origin. Many small offices never did use a straight line, oval or circular handstruck or machine struck device for that purpose and many offices which later became large towns and cities used the manuscript style while they were developing.

The alphabetized listing includes over 2,360 names of post offices, county in which located, earliest recorded manuscript marking and latest date of use of this style, insofar as reported to the Society over the extended time of card preparation. The period of record begins with our country's independence and ends with the close of the 19th century. Offices did, of course, exist in the Colonial period. Albany and New York are both known to have used the manuscript style as well as handstruck markings prior to 1772, but such are not part of our records. As well as markings from the regular offices, the monograph lists all known R.F.D. manuscript markings and any office in which the county name was a part of the despatching identification.

This book must be in the library of any serious collector of New York State postal history, indeed, almost any type of historical library. It could well serve as the model for similar works in other states. The 8 1/2" x 11" format, widely spaced lines on white, coated stock makes easy reading. There are also 24 black & white illustrations of the different types and styles of manuscript markings, tipped into the book as a centerfold.

In 1794 the Willsborough Block House was built following the Indian victory over General St. Clair. This was at a cost of L96. When Essex County was created in 1799, the enabling act directed that the Court of Common Pleas and the General Session of the Peace be held at the Willsborough Block House. As The town of Essex was not yet established, the Court House was thus located in the Town of Willsborough.

The Town of Essex was created from the Town of Willsborough on April 4, 1805. The Court House was then included in Essex a few hundred yards from the Willsborough townline and about 1/2 mile from the village of Essex.

According to an article in the Adirondack Record Elizabethtown Post (June 7, 1973) by 1807 a commission composed of Clinton and Washington County residents had been appointed to designate a place for a new court house. In 1811 a new court house had been erected in Elizabethtown. From 1811 to 1821 there was a post office named Elizabeth Court House and who should be the first postmaster but our old friend Theodorus Ross, who had been placed in charge of building the new court house.

One ESPHS officer says that a usage such as the above Essex Court House was very unofficial and not truly indicative of the correct name of the post office. However, the letter quoted at the very least throws doubt on the listing in Kay and Smith.


