FOOTPRINTS OF FOUR CENTURIES

Hamilton W Mabbie
International Publishing co, 1897

(from Roy Ahlquist)

In the following story, Dr Mabbie was making the point that the post rider performed a valuable communications function in colonial times, and the inn was the center of information. The following appeared on pages 656 to 659.

"Here seems a fitting place for recording the story of Jacob the Roman, in which the post-rider figures as sort of Dutch Hermes. The story is told by the Dutch Hermes. The story is told by the Rev Dr John Knox Allen of Tarrytown. Just at the foot of the high point called Wyk-uit there long ago dwelt a man who was called Jacob the Roman. He was a German by birth and in the centuries past his ancestors had come, perhaps with Julius Caesar, from Rome, and after the conclusion of the war with the Gauls had settled among the now friendly War-men, whom we today call Germans. Living in the highlands of Southern Germany, the old name still clung to them. 'Jacob the Roman' was well educated, but he was poor. He was respected in his native town and had won the affection of the Herr Obermeister's lovely daughter - her name Judah Trenagh. But poverty hindered the progress of his suit, and he determined to try his fortunes in the new world. Judah would not be left behind. By night they left the town and traveling by unfrequented paths at last reached the coast. But now their money was exhausted. Nothing daunted, they secured their passage across the ocean by articles of agreement with the captain of a vessel, which articles allowed him to sell the two for a term of years to whoever in this land would pay the price of their passage, and secure it from the proceeds of their This was no unusual thing in that Thus those sold were called Redemptioners, because the price of their redemption from bondage was fixed at so much labor, or its equivalent in money. A calamity not anticipated befell them on arrival - they were sold away from each Exchanging the vows of eternal other. fidelity, they parted.

"In time Jacob worked his freedom, and on the east side of Kyk-uit, near a little brook, bought a little homestead and built for himself a house. He had learned to speak the low Dutch of the people, and was a tailor by trade. They came to him to make their garments and to listen to his many stories of life in the old world. He was respected by all; he increased in goods, but was not happy.

It was years since he had seen Judah. Where was she? Was she living? How should he ever find her? His former master told him he had heard that she had been sold somewhere west of the River. His love stimulated his wits. Anthony Seegere was 'der Post-reite,' and made his monthly circuit with the colonial mail from New Amsterdam to Fort Orange, going up the west side of the river and down the east. Jacob confided in him, and the postman espoused his cause with sympathy, and promised to inquire in every village for 'one Trenagh,' according to the description Jacob gave him; and if he found her, and she were willing, he promised to bring her back with him on his horse. For this service Jacob was to give him seven dollars in New York Jacob showed him the money. currency. and laid it away against the demand. The postman went and made inquiry, returning month after month on his steady old horse, and brought no news. Jacob's heart sank within him, just as do the hearts of people in more splendid romances.

"At last the old postman met a person who thought he knew a woman who fit the description. He would see her, and if she were the one would bring her to fort Orange against the time of the next circuit. Jacob was wild with excitement. Was this the woman or not? What Joy or sorrow would the postman bring him next month? The month rolled around. The slow steed came ambling down the river roads and up the hills, and bore Anthony and his saddle-bags, and on the pillion was seated Judah too. Any good novel will tell you what they did when they met.

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING



TRIP TO AMERIPEX

Under the rules of the International Philatelic Federation, a country may host an international philatelic exhibition only once in a decade. The last international in the U.S. was INTERPHIL in Philadelphia in 1976. Next year, the U.S. will again host an international as AMERIPEX will be held in Chicago from May 22 through June 1, '86.

Plans for a trip to AMERIPEX are being made. Many details are still to be settled, but the main facts are:

Leave Albany in late afternoon on WED May 21, and return from Chicago in early evening on SUN May 25th. Four nights in Chicago. Travel by airplane, cost for transportation, lodgings, tax, gratuities, & fees at less than \$300. Approximately 40 persons are needed to fill the trip.

Any members of the ESPHS who feel that they would be interested in joining this philatelic junket are asked to write and let us know. Everyone who expresses a desire to join the tour will be provided full details as they develop, and will be solicited for their final commitment and deposit as plans require in due time.

I got a chuckle out of an item in the same file from reader Robert S. Buckalew in California who sent me a clipping from an 1898 newspaper about some of the complaints handled by national postal officials:

"The Post Office Department in Washington, D.C., had occasion recently to call the attention of a postmaster in a small Missouri town to complaints made to the department regarding the conduct of his office. In response to the department's letter the postmaster sent the following reply:

" 'The postmaster and the complainant live on adjoining lots. The complainant is a thin, cadaverous, sourvisaged, lantern-jawed individual, completely sterilized, and much devoted to cats, of which he has a varied and interesting assortment.

" 'The postmaster has a boy — not a bad boy, as boys go - but just a boy. Other neighbors have other boys.

" 'One day, inspired by the imps which are charged in mystic lore with being responsible for all the wickedness of the world, these other boys inveigled the complainant's cats into a race with a neighboring dog, from which pastime the cats returned in a somewhat ruffled and dilapidated form.

"The complainant became exceeding wroth, and at the first opportunity interviewed the postmaster's boy in the back alley relative to the said cat race, and, notwithstanding the boy's earnest denial of any participation in the sport, backed by an offer to prove an alibi by showing his presence at the swimming hole at the time of the race, the complainant continued to charge him with wrongdoing and to revile him in heated and forceful

" 'The boy, stung by charges of which he was not guilty, gathered sundry old tin cans, discarded boots and dried vegetables in the back alley, and when the shades of night were falling fast, elevated them into the air at an angle which cause them to fall into complainant's back yard, since which time the administration of this Post Office has utterly failed to find favor in the sight of said complainant.'

Life must have been simpler in both Washington and Missouri in those days.

"One incident is to be added. Judah often told how she attracted the attention of whole villages on the first day's ride on horseback from Fort Orange. He She was not an equestrian, and smiled. in her innocense supposed it was not possible to ride a horse except astride. And she had not liked to embrace the old man, and so had mounted looking the other It was hardly to be wondered at that the people smiled as they saw her clinging to the saddle-bags, and with her face turned toward the scenes they were fast or rather slowly leaving. The old postman showed her how to ride upon the pillion, and their journey ceased to attract especial attention. There was, of course, love in the cottage, though the furnature at first was little, one old chest containing crockery and utensils, serving also as tailor's bench and table. Eight children were born to them. In his old age, the good Jacob said one day: 'I prays mine Cott, I never knows a sick ped.' That very evening, as his wife approached to help him into bed, he met her with the old look of love, stretched out his hands, tried to speak and was gone."

Footnote. "Rev Dr John K Ailen, the author of the above sketch, is at the present time pastor of the First Reformed Church, Tarrytown, NY which includes the historic "Old Church of Sleepy Hollow...
