THE TREMONT POST OFFICE

The post office in the village of Tremont, part of the Town of West Farms, was opened on August 3rd, 1861. It was established to serve the surrounding villages of Belmont, Mount Eden, Mount Hope and South Fordham.

Tremont was made up of all or part of the former villages of Upper Morrisania, Adamsville, Mount Hope and South Fordham. 1870 census figures give it a population of 2,025. Mount Hope and Mount Eden, listed separately, had populations of 487 and 116 persons respectively. 1865 figures gave the population of South Fordham as 243 persons.



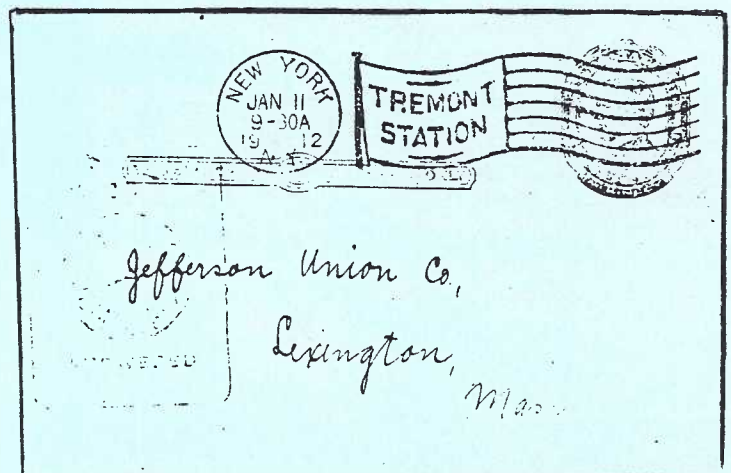
The village was created as a service area for the surrounding countryside. It was given the name Tremont to differentiate it from the Town of Morrisania, formed December 7, 1855, which lay directly south of it. Estates separated the two entities.

The first postmaster of Tremont was Herman Tarbox II. The post office was opposite the railroad station, one half block south of the place where what is now Tremont Avenue crossed Railroad (now Park) Avenue. This railroad station not

only served the Tremont area but also the villages of West Farms and Fairmont, which are one and one half to two miles east via Tremont Avenue.



In 1870, the Tremont Post Office was the fourth largest in what is now the Bronx, being exceeded in size only by the post offices of Morrisania, West Chester and Fordham. It was larger than the post office at West Farms, which was the Town Seat.

Beere's Atlas shows that the major area of population was north of Tremont Avenue and between Railroad (Park) Avenue and the Fordham Road (Third Avenue). To the south and east of this area were located small estates. The village of Fordham lay one and one half miles to the north. Belmont lay southeast of Fordham astride the Kingsbridge Road out of West Farms Village.

The village itself consisted of a police station, two saloons, a bakery, a shoe shop, a druggist, a butcher shop, a marble shop, and several other stores. The village had two churches. A public school was located on the Fordham Road three blocks south of Tremont Avenue. A judge lived next to the police station, so that there may have been a court in Tremont.

Besides the post office, the railroad station area contained a piano factory, a hotel, an express company and a stable. Tremont contained approximately one third the population of the Town of West Farms. The Town was annexed to New York City in 1874.

When the Tremont Post Office was joined to the New York City postal system in 1874, Mr Tarbox II was still Postmaster. In 1875, Tremont became part of the NYC postal system under it's own name. In 1881 it's name was changed to Station T. At this time (1881) it also became the post office for West Farms and Fordham whose own post office had been closed. The office regained it's name, Tremont, in 1898 when Station T was moved to 165th St and 3rd Ave to become the new post office for what had been Upper Morrisania. The Tremont post office remained part of the NYC post office until 1962 when it became part of the Bronx County system. It lost it's Fordham area in 1896 when the Fordham station was reestablished and it's West Farms area in 1915 when that areas post office was reopened.

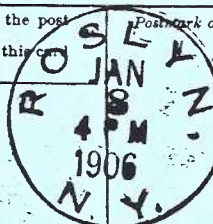

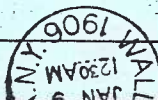
