DO YOU KNOW THIS POSTMASTER?

JOSHUA HATHAWAY, ROME, N.Y. by John B. Ludin, M.D.

JOSHUA HATHAWAY, second postmaster of Rome, was born in Suffield, Conn. on August 13, 1761.


He fought in the Revolution at the Battle of Bennington with General Stark, studied at Yale and migrated to Fort Stanwix (Rome) in 1795. He was appointed postmaster of Rome by Pres. Madison in 1808.

During Hathaway's administration the mails arrived twice weekly from Utica, usually on horseback. When it reached the post office, Judge Hathaway would say in a stern voice to those present "Gentlemen, the United States mail has come. Be seated and take off your hats and no talking while the mail is being distributed."



Hathaway was Quartermaster-General of the New York State Militia, served at Sacket's Harbor in the "Rome Regiment" in the War of 1812. He was one of the first lawyers in Oneida County, a prominent member from its first organizational meeting, served as surrogate from 1808 and was Judge of the Court of Common Pleas until his death in

At his death his son Jay succeeded him as Rome postmaster. Both men franked their mail J. Hathaway.



Above is an 1808 folded letter sheet from his daughter Sally to his son Jay in Hartford, Conn. mailed under Joshua's frank - March 3, very early in his first year as postmaster.

On Joshua Hathaway's headstone in the Rome Cemetery is written "To him was assigned the honor of breaking ground on commencing that great and beneficial work, The Erie Canal, on July 4, 1817.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE EMPIRE STATE POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY ON MAY 4, 1986

The annual meeting of the ESPHS was called to order by President Haefeli at 1:50 PM at Karrat's Restaurant in New Hartford, NY. Approximately 25 members and guests were present.

The Secretary-Treasurer read the annual report of the Society. This report is published elsewhere in this edition of the Bulletin. The report was accepted as read.

The 1985-86 financial report was then presented by the Secretary-Treasurer. The report showed a net gain in assets of \$814.11 during the year. The financial report, also published elsewhere in this Bulletin, was accepted as read.

Reporting on awards and show support, the President reiterated what was noted in the Secretary's report. It had been a slow year for collectors showing their N.Y.S. material. The awards committeewill continue its efforts to recignize meritorious displays of the Empire State's postal history.

George Bernadt stated that there may exist a current postal history backlash among collectors, and that this shift in perspective may account for the paucity of exhibits. The effectiveness of having the Society subsidize exhibit fees was also raised. Cliff Tuttle mentioned that CINCOPEX '96 would be glad to welcome N.Y.S. postal history exhibits. This show is scheduled for October, 1986 in Sidney, N.Y.

Emma Koberg reported on regional meetings. Richard Kase has agreed to try to organize such meetings in the Rochester area whereas Roger Kline will do the same for the Buffalo area. The availability of meeting sites was noted as a key obstacle to these affairs. This sparked a detailed discussion on the subject.

There was also mention made of trying to organize a regional meeting in the lower or central Hudson Valley.

Bill Seifert reported on the affairs of the publications committee. The supplement to the manuscript post office book is almost ready for publication. Details regarding its format must still be determined. Chet Wilcox has been the editor of this work. Also, Dave Proulx's compilation of star-type fancy cancels used in N.Y.S. is well along, and will be ready later this year.

George Bernadt requested everyone to send him their extra material for sale in the auctions. More material is constantly needed for this popular activity of the Society. George noted that consignors must realize that common material cannot be expected to bring high prices, but that decent material sells for competitive amounts.

Nick Todaro suggested that the Society consider publishing a collection of its best N.Y.S. postal history articles in conjunction with the 1996 international show in the U.S. The committee will consider this suggestion.

George Bernadt spoke briefly about his work on a N.Y.S. stampless cover book. This is a big task that will require much cooperation from the membership. George asks that everyone send him photocopics of "A" post office covers.

J. Burton Hulbert reported on publicity. He had recently solicited ads for the Bulletin. News items are sent to the phila-press whenever possible, but these don't always find their way into print. These efforts will be continued.

A show was announced for August 9-10, 1986 in Cooperstown. This will be a pleasant local show in a beautiful area of the State.

The Treasurer presented details on the proposed 1986-87 budget. The budget projects a deficit of \$290 for the year. This was adopted by the membership. The budget is published in this issue of the Bulletin.

Nominees for directors were announced to be Roger Kline, Charles Sweeting, and J. Burton Hulbert. A motion directing the Secretary cast a single vote in favor of the slate was passed, and the directors were duly elected for three year terms.

President Haefeli announced that the semi-annual meeting was scheduled for October 5, 1986 at Karrat's. The meeting was adjourned at 2:48 PM.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SECRETARY FOR 1985-1986

The 1985-86 year of the Empire State Postal History Society was characterized by a steady course of postal history pursuit, and not by many noteworthy or significant accomplishments. The state of the Society remains sound. Membership has increased slightly, finances are healthy, and the administration of the Society has continued in the hands of a dedicated cadre. Also, the Society has a number of on-going projects, projects which are being considered, and projects in mid-stream, all of which will result in future gains in our goals.

Membership

The 1985-86 year started with 196 members in good standing. During the year, the following membership statistics were compiled:

New Members - 20 Resignations - 2 Deaths - 3 Expulsions - 12

By year's end, the membership increased by three to 199. Two applications are on hand for posting in the May and June issues of the Bulletin.

Meetings

During 1985-86, the annual meeting was held on May 5, 1985 and the semiannual meeting on October 6, 1985. Both occurred at Karrat's Restaurant, our regular meeting location by Utica.

One regional meeting was conducted in the Rochester area. This was organized by Emma Koberg, and was reportedly well received. For the first time in quite a few years, an Albany regional meeting was not held due to problems with securing a suitable meeting site.

It is an avowed aim of the Society to promote more regional meetings wherever they can reasonably by put together.

Publications

The Bulletin of the ESPHS was issued five times. A 6th issue was due in April, 1986, but instead, will be issued in May. Increased participation by the members in submitting articles for publication was noted. Members are urged to continue and to increase such support. An updated roster was distributed with the December, 1985 Bulletin for the convenience of the members.

Our manuscript book won a vermeil award at the SESCAL literature show in California. Although sales of this book have slowed, we plan to do more advertising in the coming year.

Our editor has computerized the mailing list thus enabling us to print an updated roster without a great deal of editing as had been required previously.

A reference on N.Y.S. star cancels by Dave Proulx is expected to be completed during 1986-87. Chet Wilcox has been hard at work on the manuscript update, and the Society hopes to have this supplement completed next year as well.

The Bulletin is exchanged for similar publications from 13 other organizations. Our advertising from dealer members has increased during the past year.

Many people assisted in the work of the publications committee with an especial acknowledgement to the editor for his contribution.

Awards

Since our last report one year ago, the awards committee has not been idle, just ineffective. No philatelic exhibitions held this year had enough N.Y.S. postal history exhibits to automatically qualify them for a silver award.

ESPHS merit certificates were given to two exhibitors at CINCOPEX '85. Other shows either ignored our offer for awards or had no qualifyinh exhibits.

The Society has pondered ways to increase the exhibiting of N.Y.S. exhibits, but feels that the solutions have eluded us. The awards committee would welcome any comments or suggestions from the membership on this question.

Elections

A major election was held at the May, 1985 annual meeting. Jack Haefeli was elected president replacing Emma Koberg who had ably served in that capacity for a number of years. The vice president and secretary-treasurer were reelected at that meeting. Koberg, Proulx, and Azarkevich were elected directors for three year terms.

A nominating committee was set-up to find three candidates for director-ships for the May, 1986 annual meeting. The nominees are Hulbert, Sweeting, and Kline.

Anyone who wishes to play a more active role in Society affairs is urged to contact the president for either consideration as a future candidate or for assignment to a project.



This month we begin a new feature - DO YOU KNOW THIS POSTMASTER?

Our research and publication up to now has been mainly on the postal service, offices and history of the MAILS. But what have we written concerning the men and women who made the system work? Unnoticed (at least in our publication) these postal people were on duty day in and day out for long hours, even seven days a week in the early years. Every four years, or less, there was the threat of removal, for generally a change in Federal administration meant a change in postal employees - patronage was the way of life, not a way of life in the Post Office Department.

It is time for recognition. Our feature is an attempt to acquaint our readers with the person rather than the office. Some of our New York State postmasters of the past were nationally known, others little known outside their community and there were hosts between these extremes. Yet, each in his or her own way contributed to the American way outside of the postal duties and responsibilities of office, as you shall learn.

Several of our members have been asked to contribute to the feature, enough have responded to make a start. The format will be evident as we go along.

Each article will include a reproduction of that particular postmaster's frank. While this limits the articles to the first hundred years of the post offices, these are the years most abundent in our members' collections. Surely every county specialist has one or more examples. What more? A good photocopy of a portrait, engraving or similar likeness of the officeholder. Not at all easy to find but many of the once-popular county histories hold hidden treasures. Your library or history society may have a copy. Then, a story of the postmaster. Sometimes you will find this in the books you refer to, sometimes in other places. One of our contributors found pertinent data on the postmaster's cemetery marker!

Read and enjoy. Then give it a try yourself. We will re-type, edit, etc. if you ask. But only you can supply us with the basic material. If a photo is impossible so be it. JOIN THE FUN!!!



BINGHAMTON, N. Y. POSTAL MARKINGS DURING THE STAMPLESS PERIOD




Red was the most common color of markings during the stampless period.



BINGHAUTON, MAY 17








