THE FORDHAM POST OFFICE by: Martin Margulis

John Archer, a Dutchman, (Jan Arcer) was the proprietor of Fordham Manor. He purchased part of the land from Elias Doughty in the 1660's and the rest in 1671, at which time the Governor made it a manor. By 1684 he had lost it.

Archer was a quarrelsome man and people who were looking for land to farm, after his reputation became more widely known, looked elsewhere. The only settlement of his lands was a dozen houses with land for farming parallel to the Harlem River. The Boston Post Road crossed through this village and it was near the King's Bridge. The village was named after a fording spot on the Harlem River, near which it was located; thus ford plus ham. No trace of these houses has been found.

Archer used his lands as collateral for loans which were never repaid. The holder of the mortgage, Cornelius Steenwyke, took control of the land in 1684 and gave most of it to the Dutch Reformed Church in 1691.

The boundaries of Fordham Manor were the Harlem River on the west, the Bronx river on the east, 170th Street on the south (although this boundary was not settled at the time) and Gun Hill Road to the North (not so named at the time).

By 1865 Fordham's population had grown to 1658 (the railroad reached it in 1841) and by 1870 it had increased to 2151, according to census figures. Horse car service to Morrisania through Tremont was started in 1870.

In the 1820's the Dutch Reformed Church sold some of the land to the Catholic Church, which established a secondary school, St John's Academy, on it. They later added a college division and eventually it became Fordham University. The land was east of the railroad, south of what is now Bedford

Park Blvd., west of Southern Blvd. and north of what is now Forham Road. Not all the land north of Fordham Road is part of the school; most is occupied by business establishments and some provate homes. A post office, established August 28, 1850, John Berrian, P.M. was 1/2 block from the railroad station.

The Fordham area was lightly settled in the 1850-1870 period and contained several large estates. However, much of the area had been sub-divided. The heaviest population was along Third Ave. where it was joined by King's Bridge Rd. (then).

The railroad station was just west of the college and on Fordham Road. In the 1880's an "el" station was built next to it. (in the 1890's the el was extended north to Williamsbridge). Near the station were a meat market, stables, a hotel and a bakery. There were also a feed store, a hardware store and a drug store.

A block south, where a small creek ran into the Mill Brook, were a rubber factory and a sash and blind factory, south of this was a small furniture factory.

In the vicinity were the horse car department of the "trolley" line, a grocery and another meat market. There was also a small park with a Catholic school on it. Three plus blocks south of the station was one of three public schools in the village. The village also contained three Protesant and one Catholic church. The Jerome Park Race Track was to the northwest, off King's Bridge Road and, now, Jerome Avenue.

The Fordham post office was absorbed into the New York City system in January of 1874 when the area became part of the city. It was closed temporarily in 1882, with service being provided to the area by the Tremont post office. The latter's mailmen picked up as well as delivered letters and sold stamps. According to Kay and Smith, a branch post office was reopened in 1906, which became part of the Bronx County system in 1914.

From 1874 to March 17, 1875, the post office was independent, though part of the NYC sustem, Jacob Cole, P.M. It operated as a branch office of the NYC system until the end of 1881, same P.M. William H. Briggs, William Cooper, Anthony Fisher, Peter Hurley and Walter Valentine were also postmasters of the Fordham post office.



The arrival of the el in the 1880's and the building of the Jerome Av 1RT Lexington Av line, spurred the growth of the Fordham area. The building of the Grand Concourse made it a prime commercial as well as, on the Concourse, residential area.

One of the results of this increase was the opening of the short-lived Bedford Park branch post office (1899-1906). This branch was closed the day before the Fordham branch post office was reopened.

At the present time Fordham has lost its "glow". Most of the better stores have closed or moved away. The housing stock has deteriorated and along Webster Aveue, the former site of Mill Brook, vandalized into ruin. There is occasional "scatter site" housing. The el is gone and service on the railroad lines in sporadic.

However, the Bronx is closer to downtown New York than is Middletown, and one day the run down houses will be bought up by speculators and latter resold to builders. Already an effort is being made to revitalize the Fordham area. It's happening else where in the city, so why not the Bronx?

The post office is sill near the train station, about two blocks away. The mail that once came to the NYC GPO and went by train, now comes and goes to the Bronx GPO on 149th Street and the Grand concourse, by truck.
