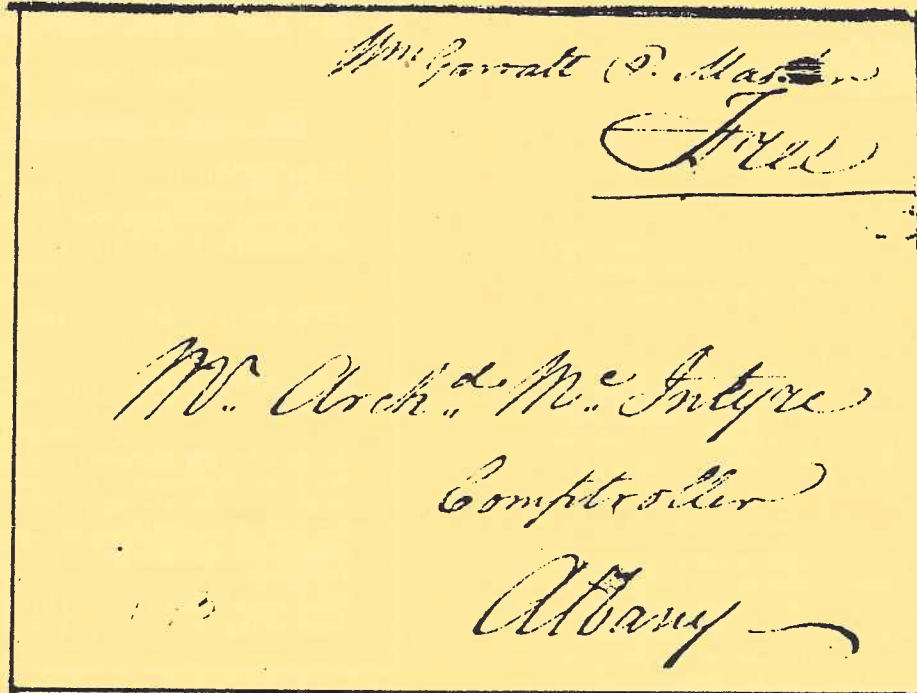

DO YOU KNOW THIS POSTMASTER?

WILLIAM GARRATT, GARRATTSVILLE, N.Y.

Garrattsville is located in the Town of New Lisbon, Otsego County, in the western and central part of that county. New Lisbon is today, as it has been from the first, an agricultural town.

The village is named for John Garratt, who purchased land there and settled prior to the Revolution. He and his wife were taken prisoner and the story of the capture and return is from an Otsego Co. history published in 1878. When they saw the Indians approaching their cabin, Mrs. Garratt seized her clock and silverware, fled out the rear door of the cabin, hid the silver under an inverted pig-trough and quickly placed the clock under a garden fence. When they returned seven years later everything had turned to brush and weeds but the silver was found under the pig-trough and the clock under the fence.

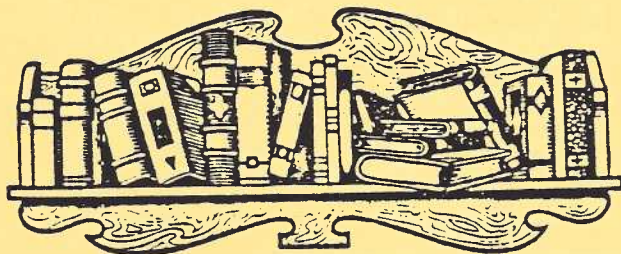
Approximate time: 2:00 PM

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AN EARLY LAST DAY COVER

This folded letter is a last day cover for the Chenango Point post office. The name of the post office was changed to Binghamton on May 29, 1830. The date in the manuscript marking is 28 May and the letter is dated May 27, 1830.

There are several interesting things about this cover. Why does it have a manuscript marking? Handstamps were used as early as 1817. Many handstamped markings of Chenango Point on covers are poor, indicating the devices were badly worn, and they may have been discarded. Another possibility is that the letter was posted late in the day and it was easier to use a manuscript marking than to try to locate a handstamp. The letter is headed Binghamton. Numerous Chenango Point letters were headed Binghamton, indicating many residents used the name Binghamton for some time before the name was changed officially.

Whatever the situation the folded letter is a desirable item. It was in my possession for a long time before its importance was realized.

Dear Sir,

I have recd Mr. Wright's survey of a certain tract of land to be in Cayuga in a few days. I have it certified.

When in Albany I paid the taxes on ch. 27, to \$26 amounting to \$14.38.

I have not yet seen Elisha Wellman about the 40 acres in the S.W. corner of the lot. I shall however soon write him to get a deed.

I enclose you a draft for \$40, which you will please to endorse on my note and acknowledge the receipt.

WILLIAM GARRATT, brother of John was a pioneer merchant in the village. The PO was established March 23, 1809 in his name (a common custom in the early 19th century) with William as first postmaster and continues to this day. It is the fourth oldest in Otsego County, only Cooperstown, Hartwick, Milford and Unadilla have survived longer without a name change or relegation to branch or station status.

No doubt that William, the 1st postmaster was a leader in the community for when the Town of New Lisbon was organized in 1807 he was its first supervisor, a post he held until 1814.

Illustrated is a FREE franked letter, date-lined "Garrattsville in New Lisbon" 29 Nov. 1813. It is to the State Comptroller (another item from the NY STATE COMPTROLLER find!) dealing with a tax collection problem, while Garratt served in the dual role of village postmaster and town supervisor. It is in extraordinarily fine condition, due to the quality of the paper used.

It is interesting to look at this 173 year-old letter while we scribble on our chemically-treated papers. Can they or our scribbles be here for that same length of time?

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SUPPLEMENT TO THE ESPHS MANUSCRIPT BOOK

This is an explanation of the listings in the supplement to the manuscript book.

Inclusion of the county name is an indication of a new listing. Entry of the county name in parentheses is used to differentiate two offices with the same name.

Entries in earliest and/or latest columns are for several reasons. They may be entered for actual new dates, or to correct erroneous dates caused by typing errors on my part or occasionally on the part of the final typist. Another purpose is to add data to the previous entry, such as month and day when only the year date was recorded previously. In some cases the only addition is the stamp number.

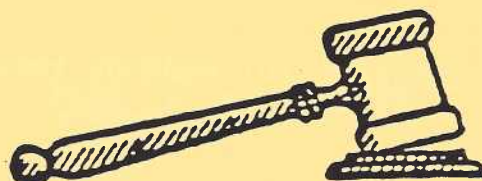

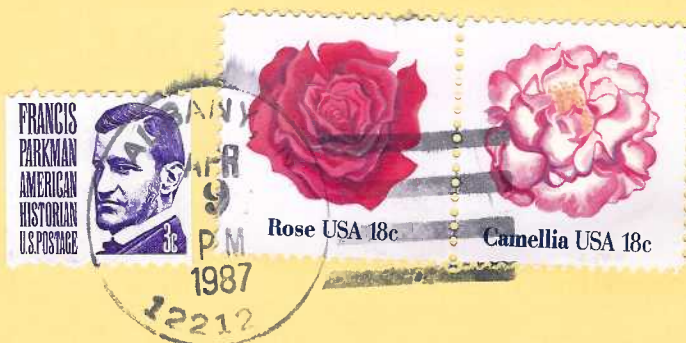
