ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SECRETARY FOR 1987-1988

The 1987-88 year of the Empire State Postal History Society was characterized by chronic problems with respect to having too few members actively participating in Society affairs. As a result, many projects went undone and the Bulletin was temporarily pared down to a minimal publication primarily consisting of Society news and the auction.

The Society in under-going a limited transformation as the older leadership is phasing down its role, and the void is only being filled slowly and only in part. Aside from being my report to the membership, this is an appeal for capable members to increase their active participation through assumption of small responsibilities.

Membership

The 1987-88 year started with 204 members in good standing. Adjustments to this total occurred as follows:

New members 13
Resignations 3
Deaths 1
Expulsions 12
Reinstatements 1

The net change was a decrease of two members for a new total enrollment of 202. Our membership plateau of 200 was maintained for yet another year.

Meetings

During 1987-88, the annual and semi-annual meetings were held on May 3, 1987 and October 4, 1987 respectively. Both meetings of the general membership were held at Karrat's Restaurant in New Hartford, N.Y.

The secretary does not know if any regional meetings definitely occurred during the year. However, plans for a regional meeting in East Aurora on June 21, 1987 were announced, and we assume that this was held as planned.

An Executive Board meeting was held in New Hartford on April 10, 1988.

The semi-annual meeting in October, 1987 was marred by the freakish, severe snow storm that devastated the eastern part of the state and New England. A contingent from the east was unable to travel to the meeting in spite of plans to do so.

The Society continues to offer support for regional meetings by providing a budget appropriation to cover the cost of postage, rent and

other associated expenses. However, the success of such gatherings is up to local activists who must organize and preside over such meetings.

Publications

The Bulletin was published on its usual bimonthly schedule. However, almost all the feature articles were omitted because of the lack of an editor. Editor Haefeli announced in the August, 1987 Bulletin that he was resigning that position, and the period since then has seen a protracted effort to reach a solution to this problem as no individual has stepped forward to take the job.

A plan to modify the Bulletin publication procedure has evolved, and the E/B has given its assent to trying it out. In general, this will include the division of duties into smaller editorships, and the use of paid typists.

An accomplishment during the year was the preparation and distribution of a new book by Dave Proulx entitled "Star Cancels of New York State." This book was years in the making, and came out amid general praise. The Society gratefully acknowledges the financial support given this project by Mrs Royden Lounsbery. Publishing and distribution costs were totally provided by her bequest to the Society in memory of her late husband, an active and dedicated collector of N.Y.S. postal history. The Society also thanks Dave Proulx for his considerable effort in compiling the book.

The Society has received another manuscript for a book on Otsego County postal history. Plans are to publish this very promising tome during the 1988-89 year.

Awards

Two E.S.P.H.S. silver awards were presented during the year. The first of these went to Dave Proulx for his exhibit at SYRAPEX '87 entitled "Manlius Post Office Stampless Cover Markings." The second went to Dr. John Ludin at CINCOPEX '87 for an exhibit entitled "Early Prepaid Postal Covers 1846-69 of Oneida County."

In addition, E.S.P.H.S. certificates were presented at both of these shows to other eligible exhibits. No other shows availed themselves of our awards during the year.

A new awards and show support chairman is needed for the upcoming year. We thank Ken deLisle for handling this task for the last several years.

The small net gain during the year compares with a budgeted deficit of \$740.00.

The Society had set out to use the

Roy Lounsbery bequest to publish the NYS Star Cancellation book and give each member a copy without charge. This initiative cost the Society \$496.83. This cost was defrayed through sales of the book to non-members.

The certificates of deposit were renewed during the year for 18 months at 7.75% interest.

A supply of the NYS Postal History book by Smith & Kay was replenished resulting in inventory in place of cash. This was an unbudgeted expense.

Dues collection for 1988-89 has just begun, and most receipts will be shown in the 1988-89 ledger. The budget had shown income of \$350.00 from this revenue source.
