STATEN ISLAND AND CUNARD BY ROBERT S. MILLER SR.

Sir Edward Cunard, son of the founder of the Cunard Line, came to New York in the late 1840's to become the manager of the line in America. In 1850 he purchased 38 acres of land on Staten Island, from John Meil, a friend of Henry Thoreau. In 1852 he built a mansion which he called "Bellevue". The home, situated on one of the highest places on the island, had a study on the third floor from which Sir Edward could watch his ships as they sailed into New York harbor through the Narrows. The room afforded a sensational view of the harbor from Sandy Hook, New Jersey to the Battery at lower Manhattan. It is said that each ship would sail into the cove at the foot of the hill and drop anchor where Henry Hudson first landed. In keeping with this tradition no buildings were allowed to be constructed that disrupt the view from this room out to sea. Sir Edward, his wife, three sons and four daughters lived here for many years before returning to England.

The southeast parlor, on the ground floor, has been redecorated in the Cunard tradition. Authentic Victorian furniture, a crystal chandelier and the original Italian marble fireplace, with delft blue tiles, designed in 1854, restored the room to its original elegance. The Cunard Room or "Red Room" as it is now called, is used for meetings and small receptions. In the same year the Cunard Steamship Company Inc. presented a glass enclosed model of the liner "Car-

onia" which now graces the main hall. Another addition to the main Hall is a cartoon color caricature located by the Honorable Miss Nancy Cunard in the Argent Bookshop on Burbury Road, London. The caricature is of her father Sir Bache Edward Cunard, 3rd. Baronet, M.F.H. who was the son of Sir Edward Cunard. Entitled "A Cunard", it was done by the famous "Spy" of Vanity Fair in 1881.

After their departure the house was occupied by a number of different persons and at one time was operated as an hotel. Finally, about 1917, it became the property of Wagner College. The college, which had been situated in Rochester, N.Y., moved to Staten Island in September of 1918. The original home, Bellevue, now called the Cunard Mansion became an integral part of the Wagner College Campus. In spite of the Cunards departure from Staten Island they have maintained a close connection with Wagner College. In 1958, with funds donated by the Cunard family and furniture from Staten Island residents, the mansion was completely renovated and refurnished.

The last major Cunard contribution to Wagner College is a 13,000 pound anchor which was once used on the "Media". The "Media" was the first Cunard passenger liner to be built after World War II and the first Atlantic liner to be fitted with stabilizers. It was launched in 1946 and used on the Liverpool - New

I felt it was the least that I could do under the circumstances. He was most gracious about the error. M.M.*)

Brendon McCann, a member and a friend, phoned me to say that he didn't like the format of the Bulletin. He especially disliked the fact that it is kept together with one staple. He would like a format similar to the USCC News. The News has about the same page size as the Bulletin but is printed on plain paper and folded like a magazine. The latest issue had the pages folded inside one another and was not stapled. Because of the way it is printed, the News is mailed in an envelop. This would increase the cost of production. The Bulletin is printed in Albany from where it is also distributed. We have asked Jack Haefeli, who handles these things, to look into this matter. We would like to know how any of our readers feel about this.

We received a letter from Mr. Adams who has begun working on a series of articles based on his award winning collection. We hope to start printing same in the Summer issue of the Bulletin. Also in the next issue we hope to print an article about the branch P.O.s of New York City and about NYC local delivery. Mr. Demmerle has some envelopes with branch cancels dating from 1857. He also has some insights into the home delivery situation in the City at that time. Another part of the next issue will be devoted to Jack Haefeli's study of NYS Doane cancels. He is working on bringing it up to date. As you may know, a preliminary article on them was published in La Posta.

It would be nice if a member or members would write an occasional column on NYS machine cancels including 'flags.' I collect them, in passing, from NYC, Westchester and Orange Counties. However they were and are being issued all over the state. Is there anybody out there willing to volunteer? A couple of illustrations and about 600 words per article would do the trick.

I note that not too many members, including myself, make any use of the Trading Post column. We would welcome any suggestions as to how to make this feature more useful.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Dear Members

The pieces are starting to fall into place. The Secretary tells me that there were only three resignations and you have all seen the growing list of new members in the last three Bulletins which incidentally received an accolade in the American Philatelist Affiliates column.

The Board has approved David Proulx as a member of the Finance Committee and Jack Haefeli as the Publication Committee chairman. Jack has presented us with an outline of committee responsibilities. The Board has seen the outline and are generally satisfied. I am proposing that it be further studied and formalized as part of the bylaws. This would require membership approval. He has been given the green light on the Otsego County book and we are expecting some firm figures for publishing 250 copies.

I have committed the Society to an informational table at ROPEX- March 23/24. Also there will be a Society meeting there at 1:30 PM on the 25th. I will be there all three days. I am looking for volunteers to man the table with me. For anyone attending I am asking for a half hour of your time to promote the Society. Please send me a note to confirm your availability to help. Please consider this a personal invitation.

I have appointed regional chairmen as an awards committee. They are Lewis Ellman of Carmel, LaVerne Johnson of Brockport and Alan Parsons of Elmira to cover the eastern, western and central parts of the state respectively. They will be contacting all of the known NYS stamp clubs to acquaint them with our activities, including the sponsoring of exhibition awards. Also they will be seeking to have our awards identified in the programs of the major shows.

Winter meetings have been held in three locations. The eastern group led by Bill Seifert opted for Super-Bowl Sunday and had a fine day with a turnout of 14. It was largely a social occasion with boxes and boxes of material to look at and several collections available for show. The central group on the following Sunday encountered an ice and snow storm. Seven members braved the weather and at least as many more phoned in their regrets. Dave Proulx hosted the meeting and the lunch. There were several collections available for viewing and one new member was most pleased to be able to get exhibiting pointers. A severe ice storm effectively cancelled the western meeting on the same day. Such are the vagaries of winter in upstate New York.






York run. She was sold to the Compagnia Glenovese di Armamento of Genoa in 1946 and now sails as the "Flavia". The anchor was transported to New York in July of 1953 and set on a four foot concrete base on the Wagner campus. The dedication took place on October 19, 1963. However the massive hulk of the anchor was covered with shaving cream two days beforehand on October 17th which has established a tradition which continues to this date. The mammoth anchor is painted different colors in the morning hours at frequent intervals. The exact reason or perpetrators remain a mystery.

To honor the connection of the Cunard family with Staten Island and to commemorate the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the first mail to be carried trans-Atlantic on a scheduled steamship, the Staten Island Philatelic Society will use the event as its theme for STIPEX-90. The "Britannia" which was the ship used will be featured as a cachet on show covers as will the "Cunard Mansion". STIPEX-90 will take place on April 21-22, 1990 at St. Theresa Church on Victory Blvd. and Slosson Ave. on Staten Island. (Prospectus and information available from Robert S. SUPPLEMENT TO THE ESPHS MANUSCRIPT BOOK -- PART II

About two years ago the first supplement to the manuscripts book was run in the Bulletin. This supplement added additional information to the book to bring it up to date. This, then, is the second update to the manuscript book. We will reprint the first supplement in a future edition of the paper. Obviously you will have to purchase the book if you are to make any sense out of the new material.

It is clear that what is really needed is a new edition of the Manuscripts book that integrates the new material

into the text. I feel that the data should then be broken down by county which would make it much easier to use.

Whether it should also be run alphabetically is something that needs to be decided. This would give a clearer view of all the data that is encompassed in the volume. It would be unfair to ask Mr. Wilcox to expend the effort necessary to do this. However, if it is decided to go ahead with this project, we will be able to leave this work to the Publications committee.

I again wish to thank Mr. Chet Wilcox for his effort in collecting and organizing the information. I would also like to thank Mr. Chandra and Mr. Penwell for their help in this project.



As an ex-teacher, I would find them useful in


covering local or county history. It might also be a way of interesting a child or grandchild in postal history or just plain history. Of course this is something to be decided individually.
