

THE INLET & OLD FORGE R P O

The Inlet & Old Forge R. P. O. is different than most R. P. O. 's. In this case mail cancelled this way was done so on a boat rather than a railway mail car.

The boat had a raised enclosed area at its stern, in which the railway mail clerks that were carried on the boat cancelled the mail for delivery at the Old Forge Post Office.

Maitland Desormo, in his book "The Heydays of the Adirondacks", writes that the first mailboat "The Zip" collided with "The C. L. Stowell" boat and was nearly cut in half on Second Lake. It was raised and fitted with a mail cabin at the back of the boat for the mail clerk. Then it was renamed "The Old Forge".

The mail boat started to run at about the turn of the century on the Fulton Chain of Lakes. It started at First Lake at Old Forge and ran through Second and Third Lakes to Inlet on Fourth Lake, and then returned. The mail bags were tossed to the various hotel and camp docks on these lakes from the boat.

Mr. Callahan of the Fulton Navagation Company in Old Forge ran the boat until July 1, 1929. At that time, W. Donald Burnap took over the contract to run the mail boat. The boat made two trips daily, as cancelled mail shows TR 1 or TR 2 in the cancel..

From 1929 until 1951 he had a boat built by Jack Rivet of Old Forge, which was called "Miss America". In 1951 Mr. Burnap had a boat built by the Sound Marine Boat Co., of Greenport, L.I. This boat was named "Miss Usama" which stood for U. S. A. Mail.







MISS AMERICA Boat #1

In the mid 50's, the mail clerk was taken off the boat, but Mr. Burnap continued to deliver and pick up mail around the Fulton Chain of Lakes as before on contract. His mail was picked up at and delivered back to the Old Forge Post Office.

In 1960, he bought a 20 ft. cruiser with an inboard-outboard engine, which he named "Miss Usama the 2nd". In 1969, he replaced the cruiser with an outboard boat built by Sea Barge which he named "Miss USAMA 3rd". These last two boats were strictly a one man operation.

Mr Burnap had a contract to deliver the mail in this manner to the summer residents and hotels that ran until 1977. Unfortunately, he lost his vision in 1975. However, he subcontracted with another person to finish out his contract with the Post Office.

I am grateful to Mr. Burnap for the information that he gave me about both the Inlet & Old Forge R. P. O. and the pictures of his various boats. He was very interesting to talk with and I enjoyed meeting a man of the old school that believed he had a job to do and did it with pride and satisfaction. He prides himself that he never missed delivering the mail to the


hotels and campers as per his contract during the summer season for a period of 47 years, which is certainly a very enviable record. He also mentioned that the people along his route would almost set their clocks by the time that he arrived at their docks to deliver the mail, and that he never missed getting the outgoing mail back to Old Forge in time to make that day's dispatch of the mail.

At the time I talked with Mr. Burnap a couple of years ago he lived in Old Forge with his wife. They have since moved to Whitesboro.


I am sure that he made many friends with the summer residents on the Fulton Chain as well as with the hotel keepers. Even though he can no longer see, I feel that he can picture in his mind many interesting people that he met and many events that happened over those 47 years that so many people depended upon him.

If anyone can supply the exact dates of this R. P. O., I would like to hear from them. My earliest cancel is 1905. The end of the R. P. O. cancel came when the mail clerk was taken off the boat. The Old Forge Post Office could give me no information as to this date and Mr. Burnap's estimate was the mid 50's.






