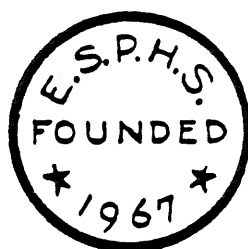

## POUGHKEEPSIE POST OFFICE

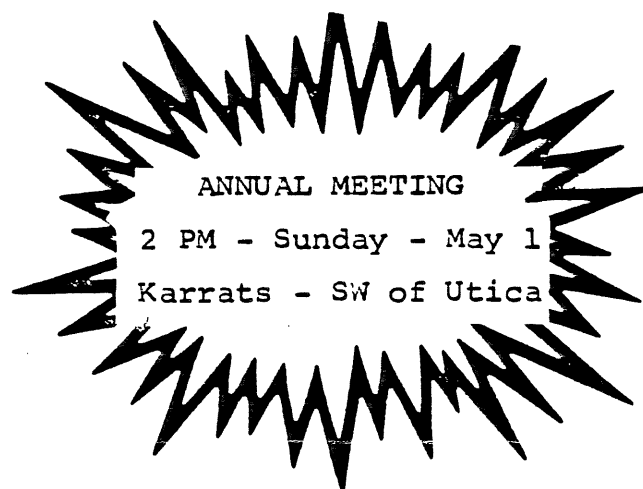

The Poughkeepsie Post Office is one of the oldest continuously operational post offices in the United States. At this writing, it is 191 years old. It was established in 1792, and Nicholas Power was appointed the first postmaster.

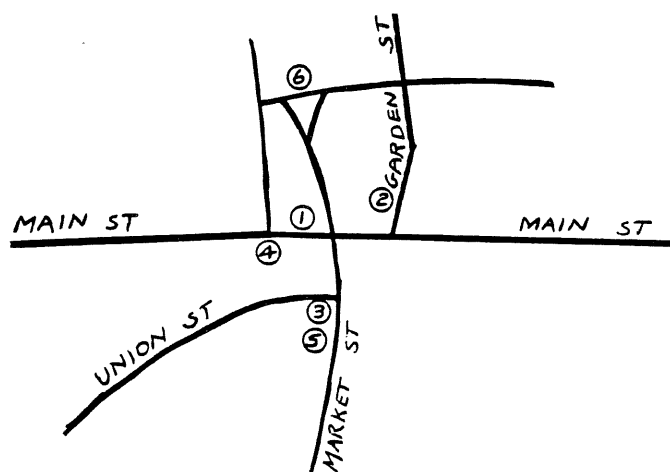
As with many early postmasters, Nicholas Power was a newspaperman. He was editor of the Poughkeepsie Journal which was then located on "the north side of Main Street, not far above VanKleek's hat store." (Eagle's History of Poughkeepsie: 1683-1905) In another reference, the location is placed "four doors away" on a stretch of Main Street known as "lawyers row."

Nicholas Power probably continued the paper began by John Holt, a resident of New York City who fled the British. Holt established a paper in Poughkeepsie, The New York Journal, between 1777 and 1783. The History of Printing in America does not list any other newspaper being printed in Poughkeepsie though the present Poughkeepsie Journal claims the paper to be in its 198th year. Nevertheless, it is probable that Power either bought the equipment from Holt, or took over Holt's operation. Additionally, there may be some relationship between Holt and Power and the establishment of the post office in Poughkeepsie. Holt was the brother-in-law of William Hunter, the Deputy-Postmaster under Benjamin Franklin. Holt returned to New York City in 1783, and one year later he died. Though no direct tie seems to be known, it is very likely that a tie existed. After all, a post office already existed in Fishkill (1776 Franklin's Ledger) and there were very few post offices in the entire nation in 1792.

American Stampless Cover Cat. To do the  
best job I can, I will need the full co-  
operation of the members of E.S.P.H.S.

Unfortunately, there is very little time  
in which to accomplish this. (I was  
originally asked to have the work ready  
for submission by April---However, of  
necessity, the deadline has been extend-  
ed a few weeks.)

Please send me all the data you can on  
your NYS stampless covers - (number of  
each you have; measurements; ancillary  
HS; etc.) I would also appreciate your  
opinion of scarcity of each on a scale  
of 1 to 10. Many of the unusual covers  
will be illustrated in the new edition,  
so xeroxs (or preferably, black & white  
photos, as the latter reproduce far better)  
are requested.

It is particularly imperative that mea-  
surements be accurate. Measure from  
center of outer rim to a point opposite  
in same rim. In the case of unframed HS,  
measure from one horizontal extreme to  
the opposite extreme & from one vertical  
extreme to the opposite extreme. Measure-  
ments should be in mm. Be sure to give  
color, vis: black, red, orange-red, etc.  
& date of cover if available.

If your collection is large, you may find  
it easier to xerox the pages of the cur-  
rent cat., cut same into columns & cement  
each col. to a blank sheet of paper &  
annotate in the large margins so created.

I know that this is very short notice &  
may raise questions (in which case con-  
tact me) but time is of the essence, so  
please, those of you that can help, get  
your data to me soonest--Don't forget, I  
will need time to coordinate the whole  
mess (you should forgive the expression!)

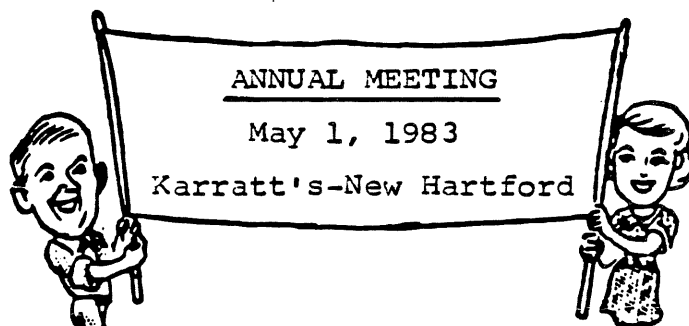

The original location served five postmasters as far as I can determine. It was not until 1829 that the post office was relocated by Benthuyssen (d. 1846) to the east side of Garden Street where it remained until May, 1851. The building which housed the second post office location burned December 26, 1870. Two of the three postmasters who operated from this location, Killey and Platt, had ties to newspapers. The third may also have.

The third location of the post office was at the corner of Union and Market Streets, the Brush House. Isaac Platt relocated it in 1851. It remained in this location under two other postmasters for fourteen years.

By 1865, Poughkeepsie was involved in a period of rapid growth. The Eastman School was established, Vassar College had begun operation and several other businesses had developed. As a result, the post office was moved to the lower floor of the City Hall which had been renovated for this purpose.

During November, 1886, Robert Hunter again relocated the post office to the new government building. This building was located where the post office had been between 1851 and 1865. The post office remained in this location, I believe, until the present location on Mansion Street was constructed under F.D.R. in 1938.

If any reader knows of any other locations, your information would be appreciated.

## Reprint: DELHI TIMES

July 6, 1982

As you enter the Delhi Post Office, you will see an interesting and informative exhibit of letters postmarked from 1803 to November 1918.

The names on some of the envelopes have a familiar sound to them, so they could have been received by some of the ancestors of families still in the Delhi area

The exhibit was loaned to John Braymer, Delhi Postmaster, by Harry Tabor of Sidney Center. Mr Tabor has been involved in collecting Delaware County postmarked letters for approximately 15 years and is a member of the Empire State Postal History Society. The Society meets in Utica, for rounds of discussion and exchanges of material in the area of each member's interest. Stamp and cover collectors are well known for the swapping practice.

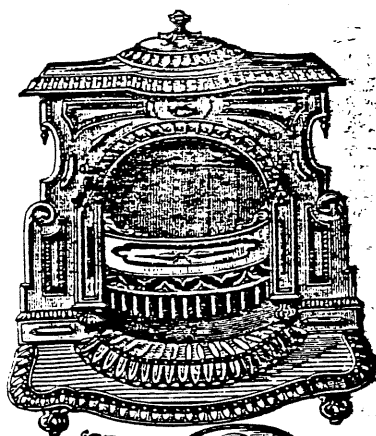
While secretary of the Society, Mr Tabor was involved in the printing of a book entitled DELAWARE COUNTY POSTAL HISTORY and had an exhibit in the Sidney Post Office. Mr Tabor would be happy to discuss his hobby with anyone wishing more information and would also appreciate hearing from anyone who has the old letters that bear Delaware County Post Office cancellations.

It is interesting to note that the earliest Post Offices were generally in Town and Village General Stores. Postmasters were paid by the volume of mail cancelled and in those days the average person could not manage to live on that amount.

In the early 1800's Postmasters were allowed to use what ever cancellation they preferred. In 1894 the Post Office Department started setting rules and regulations; the POD would supply the instrument of cancellation to be used and only black ink was to be used.

Although US postage stamps were not issued until 1847, Delaware County did not receive stamps until the middle 1850's. In 1902 there were 104 Post Offices in Delaware County. Today we have 39 in our 19 townships. The original Delhi Post Office was in what was called the Red Cross Building which was torn down. The present Court Street Post Office dates back to 1937.

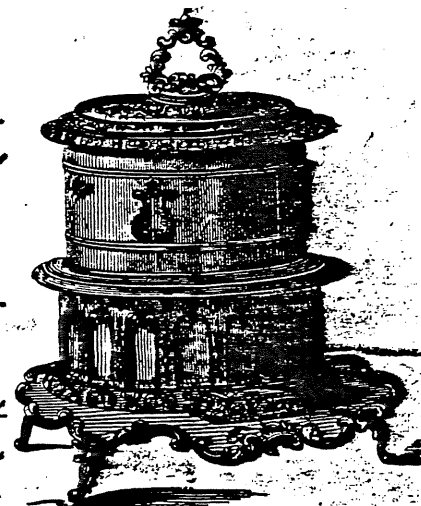

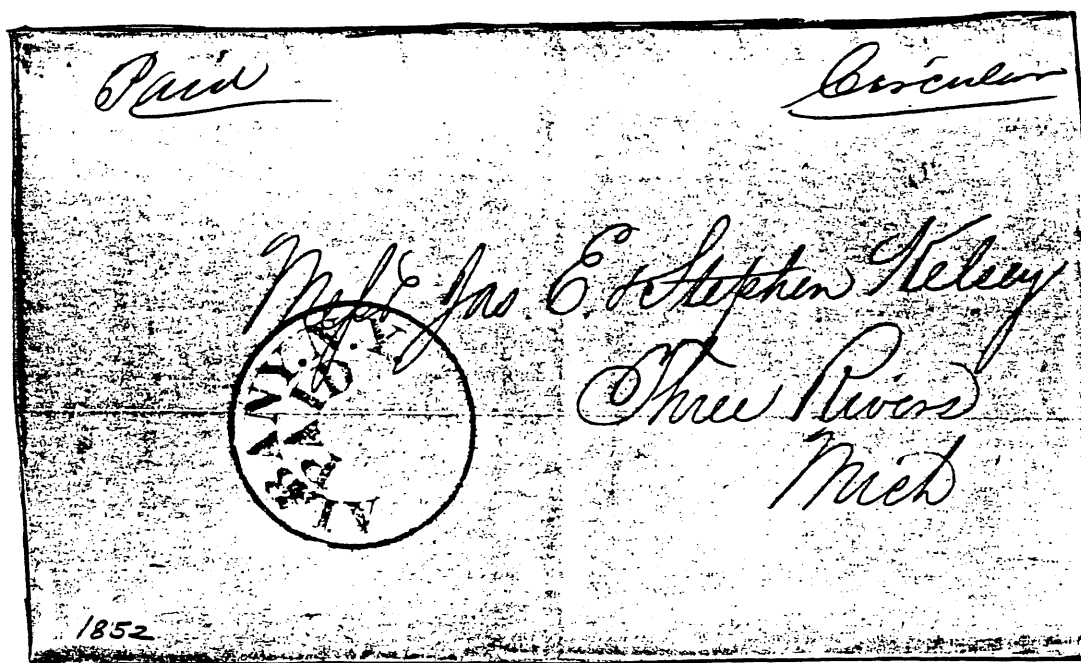

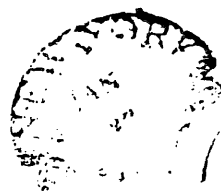
