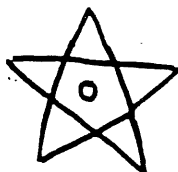

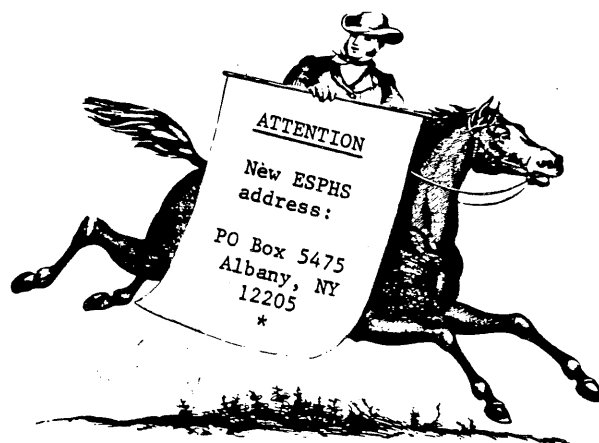


The third annual summer regional meeting

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING
MAY 1, 1983

Meeting called to order by President Emma Koberg at 2:00 P.M. at Karrat's, Utica, N.Y. There were 18 members and 2 guests in attendance.

Minutes of the annual meeting of May 2, 1982 were approved as printed in the June 1982 Bulletin.

The President called for reports by the Secretary-Treasurer, the Awards Committee, Membership Committee, the Auction Manager and the Publication Committee. All were read and approved.

Detailed treasurer's report and the report of the secretary appear in this issue, others will be presented as space is available in subsequent issues. They remain on file in the secretary's records.

At the conclusion of these reports, Bill Seifert rose to make a special announcement, a well-kept secret up to this time. He announced that the Executive Board, upon learning of the Secretary-Treasurer's decision not to stand for re-election, had convened and approved the election of Kenneth de Lisle to Life Membership, only the second member in our history to be so chosen. A beautiful plaque, suitably inscribed and a card, signed by all those members present at the October meeting was handed the astonished de Lisle, who remarked he thought he knew everything that went on in the Society but has now learned better. In his acceptance remarks, de Lisle told the members how much he had enjoyed the office for the past twelve years and felt that he could give it up with no regrets, since a very capable successor had been chosen.

Under new business, the 1983-84 budget was presented and discussed. It was explained that a major item will no longer be in our annual operating budget - that of new publications - which will be carried separately as to expense and revenue. The budget was then approved.

There followed a discussion on the awards program, sparked by outgoing chairman Tuttle. Several suggestions for the future were made. President Koberg told the members that Ken de Lisle was her choice for the chairmanship vacated by Cliff Tuttle.

There followed a discussion of the ESPHS participation in the revision of American Stampless Cover Catalogue, of which George Bernadt is NY State section editor. George outlined the latest developments and asked for help in drawing up a revision of the NY State markings. He announced several had volunteered. George also reminded the members that the Bulletin auctions always needed good material and that especially now he was in need of items for the August auction.

Next on the agenda was a discussion of our participation in exhibitions sponsored by local or regional stamp clubs.

Tuttle pointed out the difficulty experienced in communication with the local show committees. Even though we wrote to offer awards and certificates, often no reply was received. Much more can be achieved than has been our past history of success or lack thereof. A new and different approach is suggested.

The President stated that at the recent meeting of the Ex. Board, David Proulx had volunteered and was authorized to begin planning for an independent postal history exhibit, tentatively set for Syracuse in 1986.

Under consideration is a major change in our award policy, based on recent approval by the Ex. Board of a new Show Criteria and Award Schedule. Upon making this known to show committees far enough in advance, they can prepare to make sections in their shows which will become eligible for our awards. Also in the works is a program among participating shows to make their winners eligible for the Royden H. Lounsbury Memorial Award, a gift to the Society by Mrs. Lounsbury and which we plan to make available on a continuing basis.

Next came the election of officers. The unopposed slate was:

The secretary was instructed to cast a ballot in favor of this slate. Upon so doing, he was informed the election of this slate was official by the unanimous approval of the membership present.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, President Koberg declared the annual meeting ended.

SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT
FISCAL YEAR 1982 - 1983

During fiscal year 1982-83, we held our annual meeting in Utica, N.Y. on May 2, 1982. The principal business was to make formal the election of three directors-at-large. Candidates Proulx, Wilcox and Sweeting were unopposed, the Secretary cast one ballot for each, for a three-year term ending April 30, 1985.

Minutes of the 1981 Annual Meeting were approved as printed, in the June 1981 Bulletin. Reports were presented by the Secretary, the Treasurer, the Awards Committee and Publication Committee. All were approved by unanimous vote, with the provision they be published in the June 1982 Bulletin, which was done.

The annual budget for the fiscal year 1982-83 was presented and, after a review of the items by the Treasurer was approved. Finally, motion was made and seconded, then unanimously approved, to ratify the acts and conduct of the Executive Board for the past year. Thus ended the 1982 annual meeting.

The Society met for a second time on October 3, 1982, in Utica. No formal minutes were taken. The Society held two regional meetings, first in Norwich, N.Y. on August 29, 1982 and then in Albany on Feb. 6, 1983. Members Harry Taber and Bill Seifert respectively are thanked for their leadership in setting up these meetings.

The Executive Board met twice during the year, first on May 2, 1982 in Utica and then on Apr. 10, 1983 in Albany. Regular business of the Board was transacted at both meetings, minutes of which are on file with the Secretary.

We began the year with 174 members paid-up, including three subscribing members who pay full membership fee to have our publications mailed. We recorded 4 deaths, 2 resignations and 14 were dropped for non-payment of dues. We added 14 new members, reinstated 5 of those dropped, for a net loss of 1 member. We have on file several applications which will appear in the June Bulletin and be tallied in the 1983-84 report.

The Bulletin was issued six times in alternate months and mailed to members at the 1st Class rate. The extra cost of postage is warranted to expedite delivery, particularly to make the auctions timely, as the commissions earned contribute greatly to the cost of printing and postage.

As will be noted in the report of the publications committee, we published Emma Koberg's Wayne County Postal History in October 1982. The press run was 150 copies, about one-half has been sold to date.

(Continuation of Secty Report)

Complimentary copies of the book were presented to the American Philatelic Research Library, the New York State Library, the New York Historical Asscn and to the Wayne County Historical Society. Complimentary copies were presented with thanks to the author and two collaborating assistants. Two copies were sent to the US Register of Copyrights and a certificate of copyright is on file.

Several review copies were sent to the philatelic press and we have received several favorable reviews, which help with sales.

Other activities of the Society will be presented by the respective officers and committee chairmen.
