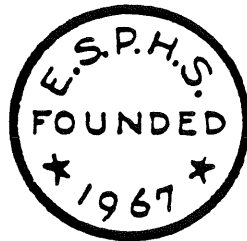

Type 49 - Star with negative lines running through it. Need better example to make copy.

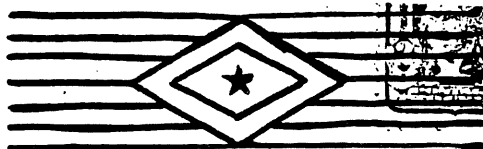
Type 50 - Like type 10 but no outline

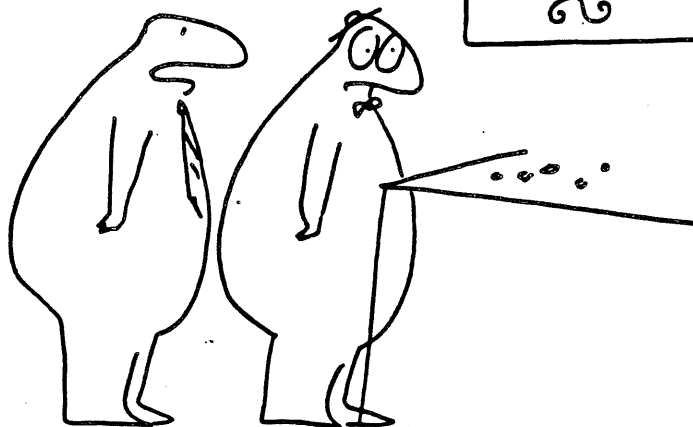

## MINUTES OF MEETING OF OCT 2, 1983

A general meeting of the ESPHS was convened at 1:55 PM on October 2, 1983 at Karrat's Restaurant, Utica, NY. President Koberg presided with approximately 20 members in attendance.

It was announced that a book on unusual early postal rates, based on material in the Lounsbery collection was being planned. ESPHS members will have an opportunity to obtain the book at a reduced price. More details will be included in the Bulletin when available.

The Society maintains an interest in promoting the exhibition of NYS postal history materials. Members are urged to work through local clubs to get more such exhibits on display. ESPHS awards are available. Awards Chairman Ken deLisle should be informed of the identity of exhibit and awards chairmen at exhibitions, especially in NYS.

Any ESPHS members who would like to help the Society with publicity, advertising, article for the Bulletin, etc, etc are urged to contact President Koberg. Everyone's talents and desire to contribute would be put to good use.

The next annual meeting will include the election of three directors-at-large. Nominations are urgently requested.

All ESPHS members are reminded to recruit new members among their philatelic contacts. Application forms are available from the secretary.

Auction manager George Bernadt reported that the sales were continuing successfully, but that there is a continuous need for material. Any member may sell through the club's auctions.

Anyone who bids and is expecting to be away from home for an extended period is asked to notify George so he can delay mailing of lots as appropriate.

A floor auction at the annual meeting next May will be conducted on an experimental basis. Plan to attend and to add some material to your collection.

Publication Chairman Bill Seifert reminded everyone of the "Trading Post" column in the Bulletin. The fee is low, and past results have been excellent by members using this service.

Publications were briefly discussed. The ESPHS policy on this topic was reiterated: the Society pays all costs of publication, and assists with editing, layout, printing, etc as needed. Proceeds from the sale of publications go to the Society. Anyone with a project in mind should contact Publications Chairman Seifert.

The annual meeting of the ESPHS will be held at Karrats Restaurant on May 6, 1984. The meeting was adjourned at 2:15 PM.

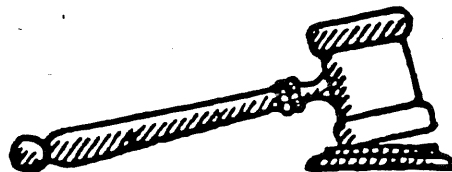

**AUCTION RULES**

**(save for future reference)**

Bidding increments are-25¢ up to \$5, 50¢ to \$20 & \$1 thereafter.

Bids under \$1 will not be entered.

All lots will be sold at one increment over 2nd highest bid.

Min bids &/or starting bids are not permitted---if an owner wishes to protect his better lots, he may indicate an amount below which he does not want to sell & if bidding does not reach this, the lot will be returned to owner at a flat charge of \$1 per lot. On all other returned items owner must pay postage & fees. There will be a charge of 25¢ on each passed lot.

Estimates shown are owners valuations &/or bidding guides & not MIN.

In case of tie bids, bid with earliest post mark will prevail. "Buy" bids are not acceptable

Lots may be examined by appointment with auction manager not less than 2 days before nor more than 10 days before auction deadline for bids.

ESPHS commission on sales is 10% to buyers only, with min of 25¢ & a max of \$5 per lot, except when lots are grouped into a single sale, in which case the max is \$5 times number of lots grouped.

Auction manager reserves the right to combine or separate material submitted by same owner into lots he judges will sell best.

Loose stamps are not admissible. Even covers should have PH interest.

Lots must have a min retail value of at least \$2.50 each.

Postage, ins fees, etc on lots purchased are charged to buyer, min 75¢
