


Albany, NY postal strikes have been around for well over 200 years. Some are very scarce and some are most plentiful. However, to me, they are all fascinating. Maybe I'm prejudiced, because I live here and love to look at them...but Albany certainly has had a long and especially interesting postal history.

While, I'm planning on writing an Albany, NY (city and county) postal history paper, at the moment I'm putting together a listing of the Albany city postal markings. In developing the format it has been necessary to assign well over 2000 numbers for use with the numbering system.

In the stampless period 100 numbers will be adequate for the job of identifying the townmarks, origin marks used in Albany, and the associated marks found on the mail.

Ken deLisle has already developed a numerical system for the stampless town marks, consisting of a series of Roman numerals from I - XV. While it has not been published it is rather extensively used by collectors of Albany material. Naturally it would be confusing to create a different system. Ken has very grac-

iously allowed me to use his numbering system and have access to his very extensive records. There is no doubt he is a leading authority in this area.

Following is the listing developed by deLisle. It evolved when he and W W L Peltz decided some order must be given to these old and historic markings dating from before the Revolution. Drawing on the Pelts collection, (now housed in the Albany Institute of History and Art, Albany, NY) spplementing it with his own and from correspondence with many of the leading "stampless markings" authorities, deLisle has made the early Albany City Markings easy to follow and understand. In reaching this goal, he states, great credit must be given to Ward Hinman and George Habbert, both of whom passed along to him their own original research.

Type VI 1799 - 1810

26 mm circle

Albany abreviated with high Y - period under Y. Abreviated NY with period at center after N and at bottom after Y

Includes month and date

Earliest known: Sept 17, 1799 Latest known: March 1, 1810

Over 10 years of use - all years known

Black strikes only

Probably only one instrument used as progressive deterioration over the period is well documented. During last year of use outer rim shows two spots, perhaps something added to prolong its life.



Type VII 1810 - 1815

27 mm circle

Albany spelled out. Includes month and date.

Earliest known: August 13, 1810 Latest known: January 12, 1815

Less than five years use

Usually black - red known but rare



Type VIII 1815 - 1819

30 mm circle

Albany spelled out, includes month and date.

Earliest known: Feb 10, 1815 Latest known: January 4, 1819

Less than four years use

Usual strikes in red. Black scarce, only recorded in first three months of use. Blue is rare, only two known in 1816.

Undated circles were used on circulars

Circle damaged early in use. Only Feb 1815 strikes are perfect. Possible second device was placed in service late in 1816 or the original was cleaned and straightened.

Type IX 1819 - 1837

26 - 27 mm circle

Albany curved around top, also month and date inside

Earliest known: March 25, 1819 Latest known: August 19, 1837

Over 18 years of use.

Description of 4 subtypes follows:

Type A: close spaced A L, complete serifs. 1819 to 1835

Type B: wide spaced A L, complete serifs, 1825 to 1834

Type C: close spaced A L, incomplete serifs, medium thick letters. 1834 to 1837

Type D: close spaced A L, indestinct serifs, thick letters. 1831 to 1837

Albany and NY. separated by fleurons, includes month and date.

Earliest known: August 21, 1837 Latest known: Feb 1, 1853

Almost 16 years of use

Red strikes only until mid 1851, then black also used .

Undoubtedly more than one device was used but uniformity of manufacture precludes type variations



Type XI 1849 - 1857

31 mm circl

Albany and NY, , also month and date

Earliest known: June 27, 1849 Latest known: June 17, 1857 (regular mail)

Almost 8 years of use

red and black strikes

used well into stamped period



Type XII 1853 - 1855

32 mm circle

Albany, N.Y., 3 paid, month and date

Earliest known: Feb 5, 1853 Latest known: Dec 28, 1855

Red and black strikes

Used on bulk mail (prepaid or charged) handed in by banks and business houses. Probably used through 12/31/55 when prepayment by postage stamps became compulsury.



Type XIII 1854 - 1855

32 mm circle

Albany, N.Y., 6 paid, month and date.

Earliest known: July 19, 1854 Latest known: Dec 23, 1855 (stampless)

About 1 years of use

red and black strikes

Used on bulk mail (prepaid or charged) handed in by banks and business houses for double 3¢ rate. Could also be used for the over 3000 mile rate. Probable use through to 12/31/55



Type XIV 1850 - 1853

34 mm circle

Albany curved at top. N.Y. curved at bottom. Month, date & PAID on interior

Earliest known: Nov 26, 1850 Latest known: Jun 30, 1853

less than three years use

Known in red, black and blue. One example recorded in green

First destictive postal marking exclusively for circulars



Type XV 1853 - 1856

32 mm circle


Albany, N.Y. curved at top. PAID curved at bottom.

Earliest known: Dec 15, 1853 Latest known: July 15, 1856

2½ years in use

struck only in black

subtype with grid of squares centered in handstamp used to cancel circulars prepaid with stamps

CIVIL WAR MAIL

In glancing through some Collectors books at the home of a friend, I came across the following article. Believe it is worth sharing with members of ESPHS. I realize the information is not peculiar to New York State but surely mail service of the Union Army during the Civil War is of interest to members of FSPHS

History of the Civil War was compiled by Benson J. Lossing LLD for War Mamorial Association, IT was published in 1912, fifty years after the Civil War.

The admirally arranged army mail- service was begun at Forts Henry and Donelson, under the auspices of General Grant, to whom it was suggested by Col. A. H."

Markland, special agent of the National Post Office. In the following letter to me(Lossing) dated July 30, 1866 Gen Grant gives a brief account of its origin:

" Dear Sir:-

Among the subjects that occupied my mind when I assumed command at Cairo, in the fall of 1861, was the regular supply of mails to and from the troops; not only those in garrison, but those on the march when active movements should begin when I commenced the movement on Fort Henry, on January 7, 1862, a plan was proposed by which the mails should promptly be sent from the Army. So perfect was the organization that the mails were delivered to the Army immediately upon its occupation of the fort. Within one hour after thetroops began to march into Fort Donelson, the mail was being distributed to them from the mail wagons. The same promptness was always observed in the armies under my command to the period of the final disbandment. It is

the scource of congratulation that the postal service was so conducted, that officers and men were in constant communication with kindred and friends at home, as with as much regularity as the most favored in the large cities of the Union. The postal system of the Army, so far as I know, was not attended with any additional expense to the service. The system adopted by me was suggested and ably superintended by A. H. Markland, special agent of the P/O Dept.

Respectfully, U.S. Grant, General"

The chaplain of each regiment was recognized at first as "Regimental Postmaster". Afterwards, the mails were brigaded. They were placed in canvas bags at GPO and sent to each brigade, under charge of military authority. The P O Dept had no further control of he Army mails after they left the office at Washington City. The regularity with which the great armies of Grant, Sherman, Thomas and others in the West, as well as those in the Atlantic States, were supplied with mails, under the general superindendence of Col. Markland, was marvelous. He and his assistants encountered dangers as appalling as those to which the soldiers were exposed. perils from bullets, fatique, and privations -- yet they never lost a mail by capture, over which they had personal control. The mail was nearly always in advance of the armies, or moving in a direction to meet them. The number of letters thus carried was enormous, "For Mother wrote Mr. S. J. Brown, the PM of Washington City, in a letter to me dated July 26, 1866, 'we received and sent an average of 250,000 military letters per day. It is believed that this number was exceeded after General Sherman's army reached Savannah, and up to the time of the review of the troops in this city in the month of May 1965.' He says that the vast number of packages of clothing and articles of every kind which were sent by the mails, reached their destination, as regularly as if the recipient lived in a large city. The only loss of any moment which this extra service inflicted upon the PO Dept. was in mail bags. "It is estimated wrote Mr. Brown, "that at least 30,000 of these were sent out which never found their way back to this office, though every effort was made by us to have them returned". This army mail service presents one of the moral wonders of the great conflict; and its value, in keeping whole armies in continual communication with friends at home, is inculcuable It was a powerful preventive of that terrible home-sickness with which raw troops are often pros= trated; and it brought the sweet influence of the domestic circle to bear most powerfully in strengthening the men against the multifarious temptations of Army life.



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
