
NYS DOANE CANCELS

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING MAY 6, 1984

The annual meeting was called to order by President Koberg at 11:15 AM at Karrat's Restaurant outside of Utica. Director Jack Haefeli was called on to serve as acting secretary.

The minutes of the May 1, 1983 meeting were approved as published in the June 1983 Bulletin. Likewise, the minutes of the October 2, 1983 meeting were approved as published in the October, 1983 Bulletin.

The annual reports of the secretary -treasurer were not read. These reports are contained in this edition of the Bulletin, and are available for comments, corrections, or questions by the membership.

Auction manager Bernadt, publicity chairman Hulbert, and awards chairman deLisle presented brief reports on their respective activities for the preceding year.

The budget for the 1984-85 year was presented. A motion was made and passed to adopt the budget.

It was noted that the ESPHS can obtair additional copies of the Smith-New York State postal Kay book on history at the same discounted price as when the book was first published. In order to gauge the amount of interest and demand for the book, an announcement is being included in this Bulletin. It was determined that slide programs on postal history would be beneficial both for local stamp clubs to use as programs and as a form of publicity for the ESPHS. More details on this will be printed in upcoming Pulletins and a plan will be devised to start such a program. It was noted that there are members in the Society who already possess the necessary equipment and knowledge to do this.

Pres. Koberg appealed to all members to contribute data and any other information about their collecting interests on NYS so that this information will not be lost to future collectors. George Bernadt and Nick Todaro will look into ways to preserve such information, and will report to the Society at a later date.

Nominating committee chairman
Bill Seifert announced that no nominations have been received besides those
made by the committee. Thus, Robert
Waite, Peter Mason, and Nicholas Todaro
were elected as directors-at-large for
three year terms.

Publications chairman Seifert appealed to all authors, semi-authors, and unauthors to forward articles, clippings, and other information to the editor for possible inclusion in the Bulletin.

It was announced that the long awaited manuscript cancellatio book will be available at the next ESPHS meeting in the autumn.

Pres. Koberg announced that the semi-annual meeting will be held at Karrat's on Sunday, October 7, 1984, and the next annual meeting will be on May 5, 1985. The meeting was adjourned at 11:40 AM.

As a matter of record, it was noted that attendance seemed somewhat larger than usual, perhaps due to the fine auction which which was arranged by George Bernadt, called by Ken delisle, and assisted by Nettie and Bill Seifert. In addition to the auction, a good number of dealers-collectors had wares for sale, and business seemed brisk the entire day. Those who do not attend these semi-annual meetings are definitely missing out on fine days of philatelic, social, and gastronomic pleasure.

EMPIRE STATE POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1983-1984

Membership

The ESPHS started the 1983-84 year with 173 members. During the year, 28 new members were added to the

roll. Nine members were expelled for nonpayment of dues, but two of these were subsequently reinstated. One member died. The net gain in membership is 20 for a year end total of 193. One of the new members requested anonymity, and will, therefore, not appear in the Bulletin or in future editions of the membership roster.

In addition, we gained one non-member subscriber to the Bulletin - the Collectors Club of NY.

This account on membership does not include new members or membership applicants as of June 1st.

Administrative Details

During the 1983-84 year, the secretary had new stationery prepared which incorporates the ESPHS logo. The membership application form was also revised and updated. Any member wishing to have copies can notify the secretary for a supply.

The address of the Society changed due to a change in the secretary-treasurer. Although some mail continues to go to the old address, the word seems to have gotten around, and most mail to the Society is properly addressed.

Mid-year, the ownership of the bank where the ESPHS checking and savings accounts are kept was changed. The Bank of New York branches in the Capital District were bought by the Schenectady Trust Co. To date, this has not resulted in any significant difference in service, and only minor inconvenience.

Meetings

Two regional meetings were held during the 1983-84 year. The first took place in Norwich on August 28, 1983. Arrangements were made by Harry Taber, Cliff Tuttle, and Peter Mason.

The second regional meeting was in Albany on January 29, 1984. Eill Seifert handled the arrangements. This meeting was especially well attended with approximately 20 members present. No business was conducted at either regional meeting.

The 1983-84 year was launched by the annual meeting on May 1, 1983 at Karrat's Restaurant by Utica. The minutes of that meeting were published in the June, 1983 Bulletin.

A semi-annual meeting occurred on October 2, 1983, also at Karrat's. This was preceded by an Executive Board meeting. The minutes of the October 2nd meeting were published in the October, 1983 Bulletin.

Bulletin and Publications

The Bulletin was issued on its prescribed bi-monthly schedule under the editorship of Jack Haefeli. Mailing was via first class.

No new publications were finalized and published during the 1983-84 year. However, significant progress was made on the NYS manuscript cancellation book which is certain to be ready during autumn 1984. This promises to be a definitive work on the subject with a broad appeal to postal historians and dealers.

Other projects are also in the works with completion dates that are projected into 1985 and beyond. Reference works on Chenango County postal history and on NYS fancy cancellations are being compiled.

Assignments and Elections

Bill Seifert resigned from the finance committee. The treasurer asked Peter Mason to fill the vacancy, and was accepted.

Early in the 1983-84 year, Henry Chlanda resigned as director-at-large. President Koberg nominated Peter Mason to take his place. The Executive Board unanimously approved the appointment.

J. Burton Hulbert volunteered to serve as publicity chairman following the semi-annual meeting on October 2, 1983.

At the annual meeting on May 1, 1983, Emma Koberg was reelected as president, Ken deLisle was elected vice president, Maris Tirums was elected secretary-treasurer, and J. Burton Hulbert, Jack Haefeli, and William Seifert were elected directors-at-large.

It is with profound sorrow we report the passing, since our last <u>Bulletin</u>, of two long-time, valued members:

ANTON H. ZAHM

"Tony" was one of the founding members of our organization and because of his legal profession was chosen to draft our Constitution and By-Laws and to rule on subsequent amendments. He served terms on the Board of Directors and his counsel was always sought at other times when important decisions were made.

He contributed to our Society in a variety of other ways, such as articles in the <u>Bulletin</u>, participating in our sponsored exhibits and giving willingly of his time as a judge in regional and local shows.

His fine collection of N.Y. State postal history, particularly the county and postmaster sections, was freely available to researchers and collectors. His contributions to our published works on postal markings added greatly to their worth. He will certainly be missed.

ROBERT A. HUTCHINSON

Perhaps the most extensive holding of New York State postal markings owned by any of our members was that of Bob Hutchinson. An avid collector for many years, first in Ithaca and later at his home in Plantation, FL he did not limit his field to any particular fad or fancy. Certain of our state's unique markings or some towns did intrigue him and he wrote not only for our <u>Bulletin</u> but also for national philatelic journals.

Like Tony Zahm, his collection was not a secret hoard. Information was available for the asking, as our editors so well know. A series of articles on Ithaca, N.Y. postal history ran serially in our publication beginning April 1978. It spanned the stampless years and a continuation into the stamp period was in preparation but ill-health over a long period prevented its completion.

The publications committee will be publishing the new membership roster in the next few monthes. If you would like to change your collecting preference or make a change in your address now would be the time to do it. NOTES ON EASTERN DOANE CANCELLATIONS



INTRODUCTION

Unfortunately very little has been published on Doane cancellations from the eastern states. Arch (1982) has published a list of the known New Jersey Doane's. To date the most comprehensive study of Doane cancellations has been published by Helbock (1982). However, Helbock's work covers only the western states. This article is a very limited introduction to an early 20th century hand cancel which was used in hundreds of 4th Class Post Offices in all parts of the United States. It is hoped that the readers of this article will have in their postal history collections many Doane cancellations which they will report to the author. Hopefully, we will in time be able to publish a far more complete list.

DOANE CANCELLATIONS: WHAT ARE THEY?

The Doane cancellation, called the "CP Numeral Canceller attached" by Thommpson (1945) is named after Edith Doane, who for many years was the leading student of this type of cancellation. It is a rubber hand stamp which was issued to 4th class post offices between 1903 and 1915. Figures 1, 2, and 3 show the basic types...the post office name is at the top, the state at the bottom and the date in the center. Various type sizes and styles are known, possibly because different contractors manufactured the cancels.



The number in the killer represented the dollar volume of compensation based upon the compensation for the fiscal year prior to the issuance of the Doane canceller. For example, if the Postmaster's compensation was less than \$100 the killer contained the number "l" or if the compensation was between \$100 and \$200 there was a "2". The number was raised with every \$100 of income.

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
