ROSWELL BEARDSLEY EXPIRED TODAY FULL OF YEARS AND HONORS

OLDEST POSTMASTER DEAD

Death has terminated the wonderful record made by Roswell Beardsley of North Lansing, N Y. as the oldest postmaster, and the oldest public official in the United States, and perhaps the world. He passed away this morning at his home after a few days' serious illness following several years of declining health, al-though he had been quite strong through the summmer.

Mr Beardsley had long been a prominent figuire in Tompkins county, where he had resided since youth, reaching the advanced age of 93 years, raising a large family and acquiring competence.

Roswell Beardsley was born in Scipio, this county, July 5, 1809, and was the second son of the Hon. John and Alice Booth Beardsley, who subsequently removed to Auburn and were long identified with the City's interests.

In early life Roswell Beardsley began a commercial career at North Lansing, where he had kept a general store ever since. In June, 1828, he was appointed postmaster at that office, and has served as such continuously for more than seventy four years. Last June a large family reunion was held at the home of one of his daughters in commemoration of that anniversary. Mr Beardsley was present and received a veritable ovation.

On a similar occasion a few years before, the following letter was read from Postmaster General Smith:

> Office of the Postmaster General Washington, D C, June 24, '98

Mr. Roswell Beardsley, North Lansing, N.Y.

My Dear Sir:- It has recently come to my knowledge that on the twenty eighth day of this month you will have served the



MINUTES

Semi-Annual Meeting of the Empire State Postal History Society - October 7, 1984

The semi-annual meeting of the ESPHS was convened at 2:03 PM on October 7, 1984 at Karrat's Restaurant, New Hartford. President Emma Koberg presided as approximately 23 members were in attendance.

The long awaited publication of an updated edition of "Manuscript Post Offices of New York State" was announced. Copies were available to anyone attending the meeting. The cost to members is \$8 until January 1, 1985 and \$9.60 after that date. Non-members must pay \$12.

President Koberg announced that other publications are also currently available to members at preferential prices. These are "New York Postal History" by Messrs Smith and Kay at \$28.50 and "Postal History of Seneca County" for \$7.20 (plus \$1 if ordered by mail).

Auction manager George Bernadt announced that the auction is always in need of additional material, and every-one should consider selling their excess material through the Society sales. These sales are one of the tangible benefits of membership, both to the seller and to the collector seeking new material.

Bulletin editor Jack Haefeli would appreciate any and all articles or other information for publication. Articles do not have to be lengthy or highly polished — anyone with an interesting cover or with information about N.Y.S. postal history could contribute to the Bulletin.

The Society has embarked upon a plan to prepare slide programs on N.Y.S. postal history. This project is proceeding although no programs are ready as yet.

The annual meeting on May 5, 1985 will include an election for ESPHS president, vice president, secretary-treasurer, and three directors. A nominating committee has been appointed by the Executive Board consisting of Messrs Seifert, Bernadt, and Wiley. Nominations from the general membership are solicited.

Bob Waite announced that he had available auction lists for a sale scheduled in Williamstown, MA on November 4, 1984, and anyone present could obtain a copy.

Publications chairman Bill Seifert informed the members that an updated membership roster will be distributed with the December, 1984 Bulletin.

(Nick Todaro inquired whether anyone present had jumper cables with them!)

An update was provided on preparation of a complete index of all articles that have appeared in the Bulletin. The index is substantially done and will be distributed soon.

The annual meeting is scheduled for May 5, 1985 at Karrat's. Adjournemnt came at 2:13 PM.

government of the United States as postmaster for a term of years long exceeding that of any other employee in the postal service. I therefore consider it a duty and a pleasure as the head of this great department of the government to make official recognition of your most unusual career.

To have served continuously for seventy years as postmaster of your village is an experience without a counterpart in this country, if in the world.

Appreciating, as we all must, the intimate relationship, official and individual, existing between the village postmaster and the community which he serves — a relationship sometimes productive of feuds and resentments, as well as confidence and friendship — nothing could more eloquently testify to the est imation in which you are held by your immediate fellow citizens than this unbroken tenure of seven decades.

Those who rejoice with you in commemorating this event may be glad to know if, indeed, there could be any room for doubt on that score - that your official record in the department is absolutely without flaw. There does not appear ever to have been the slightlest occasion for criticism or reprimand, while your long series of quartly reports, the work of your own hands, are models of accuracy.

Acceding to office under the administration of the younger Adams, and through the recomendation of New Yorks illustrious statesman, William H Seward, you have served under nineteen presidents and thirty-four postmasters general, to the entire acceptance of all.

Born during the very infancy of the century which is now closing, you have been a witness of events stupendous in character, scope and result, and unparalleled in any equal period of the world's previous history.

To the fervent hope of your immediate neighbors and friends let me add mine that your remaining years, whether in the providence of God they shall be few or many, may be cheered and brightened by the retrospect of public duties faithfully performed for a period equaling the limit of life allotted by the psalmist.

Mr Beardsley was invited to attend the two most recent presidential inaugurations as the guest of the government but was unable to accept. In response to a request from an admirer, three years ago for a sketch of his life over his signature he wrote as follows with his famous quill pen:

North Lansing, N Y, July 23, '99 A G Couch, Esq:

Dear Sir: - By the request of Mr D Kelly of this place, I write a short sketch of my life. I was born in the town of Scipio, Cayuga county, July 5, 1809, and commenced a mercantile life at this place, Jan 19, 1838, was appointed postmaster of North Lansing, June 28, 1828, under the administration of Hon. John Quincy Adams, Hon. John McLean being postmaster general. I have held this office continiously to this date, and still, continue the same in the same building since January, 1829. In 1873 I built an addition so as to accomodate Lansing lodge No. 774, F. and A. M. I have been so blessed with health that I have always made my reports to the government in person, and do my writing with a quill pen, and by his request make him one to send you. Thanking you the request of asking Mr. Kelly for a brief sketch of my life.

Yours respectfully R Beardsley, P M North Lansing, N Y

Mr Beardsley is survived by one son, four daughters; his wife, who was Isabel Conrad, of Itica, to whom he was married in 1829, having died a half dozen years since. Mr Beardsley and Mrs Marietta B Eldred of this city, and Mrs William Muir, of New York, and also the late Nelson and William C Beardsley and Mrs L V Nye and Mrs J M Alden. The funeral will be held at North Lansing on Monday at 2 PM.
