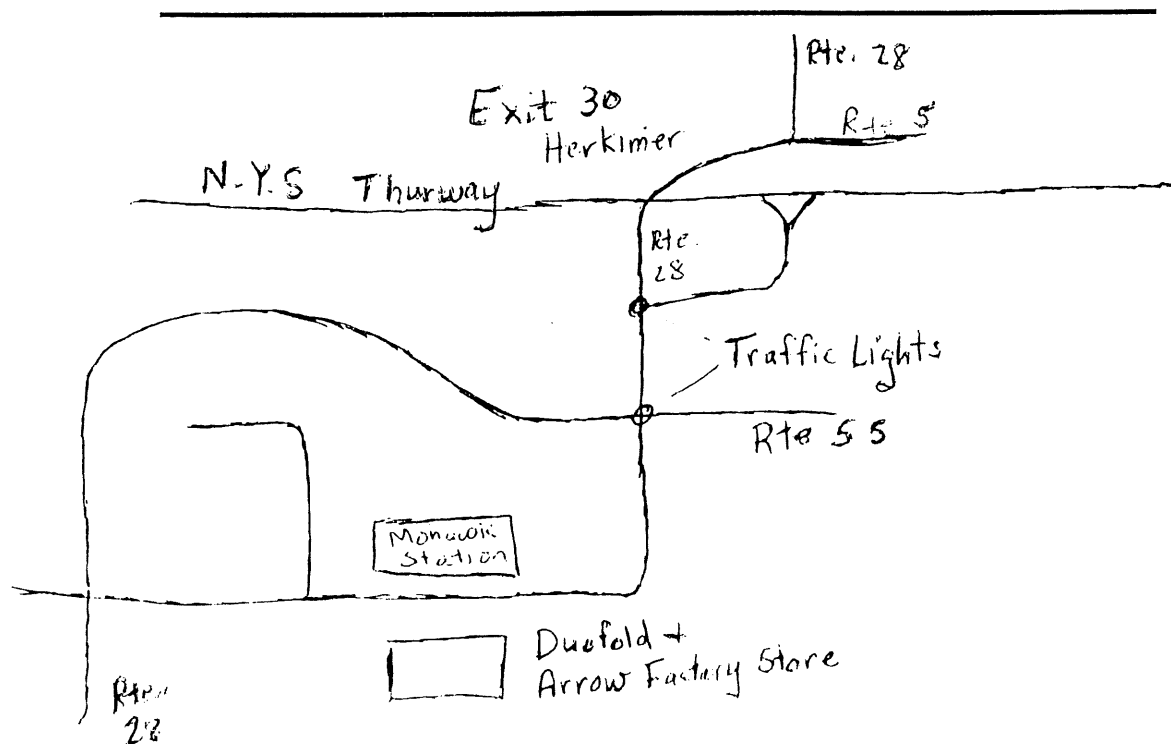
The President's Message

ANNUAL MEETING-MAY 7

The date of our annual meeting is Sunday, May 7, 1995. This year a new meeting place has been selected in central NY. Just about everyone will have to travel some distance, but we hope that its location will make it possible for the most people to attend. It will be at the MOHAWK STATION in Mohawk, NY. Mohawk is east of Utica and west of Little Falls. We hope that the map on page 1 will show the way.

In order to get a meeting place these days, one has to guarantee a minimum number of people for the restaurant meals. In this case the minimum is 15 people, so we are hopeful that ESPHS members will support us by attending and eating at the brunch which starts at 10am. It will be a buffet. The cost to us will be \$9.78 per person, which includes tip and tax. In order to make this brunch even more attractive, an ESPHS member who wishes to remain anonymous, is subsidizing the cost, so that the net price to members and guests will be only \$5.00!

The bourse and trading will start at 9:30am. All dealers and members with material to sell or trade are encouraged to participate by bringing your "stock" along. We will have some tables to put your material on. There will also be a stock of ESPHS literature for sale to members at 20% discount from list and with no postage and handling charges! Take advantage! Members are encouraged to bring their family members.

The annual meeting itself will start at about 1:30pm and will be preceded by a Directors' meeting at about 12:30pm. These times may be moved up if people are ready to start earlier.

NEWEST COUNTY POSTAL HISTORY BOOK

Otsego County Postal History by Dorothy Scott Fielder. Available from the author for \$22.25 including postage and handling. RR 1 Box 1038, Maryland, NY 12116.

This softbound book contains 221 pages, including several maps, photographs of post offices, past and present, and postmarks and cancellations from the towns of Otsego County. The subjects covered by the chapters include: a brief history of the U. S. P. S., information on postmasters, lists of all post offices in the county with their dates of establishment, discontinuance and general trends, transporting the mail, and special postal events and cancellations. Each town is dealt with, including names of all post offices and their postmasters, photographs of post offices and examples of postmarks from as many post offices as possible.

ESPHS member Fielder has combined two of her interests, local history, and information of post offices to produce this work. She is presently the Schenevus postmaster and has also worked as a clerk and rural carrier in the Maryland Post Office. She is especially active with youth philately in the surrounding area.

This work was a long time in the making and had many detours in getting into print. This latest county postal history book is now the standard by which future books will be measured. The well thought out contents are neatly and sharply printed on quality glossy stock. The many photographs and covers are beautifully reproduced and a pleasure to look at.

This book is an absolute must for anyone collecting or having an interest in Otsego County. But I recommend this book to others as well. It is a well done interesting work and will give anyone many ideas of how to work with your collection of other counties. It should sell out fast, so reward yourself now with a copy of this fine new book. Ordering information is at the head of this review. (reviewed by Jack Haeferli)

A LITTLE CONTEST

A number of ESPHS members provided answers to the quiz in the last issue:

Question: There is at least one post office in New York State whose first number in the zip code begins with a code assigned to a New England State (0) rather than the "1" assigned to the beginning of the zip codes for the rest of New York.

Answer: Fishers Island (Suffolk County) (Zip Code 06390) which lies off shore from New London/Groton, Connecticut and has ferry service from New London. Interestingly, East Point on Fishers Island lies only about 2 miles from Napatree Point, Rhode Island.

The winner was Gary Dunbar of Cooperstown, NY. Other correct respondents were Arnie Leiter, Milton Laby, and Bill Hart.

Bill Hart also provided some more information about other NY POs receiving mail through another state.

In Westchester County, Banksville (1891-1920) received mail through Greenwich, CT. In Rensselaer County, Wallomsec (1888-1931) received mail through North Bennington, VT. In Washington County, Raceville (1880-1919) received mail through Poultney, VT and in Dutchess County, Sharon Station (1853-1918) received mail through Sharon, CT.

Note that all these stations were pre-ZIP Code era. It would seem that the only stations today with different state ZIP Codes would be those which are very isolated from the rest of their states.

A little harder question (I think) this time:

At least 1 major NY city is using a handstamp which actually says has the city name and state name as would be expected. However, also on the handcancel is the word "handcancel". What city is it?

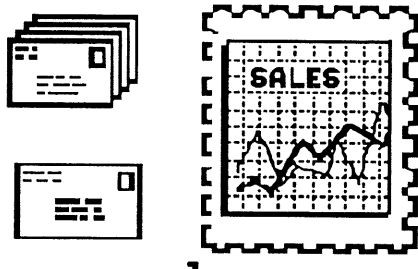
