A Request for Information

Prior to the official government issuance of perforated stamps, there was a number of private individuals (and perhaps postmasters) who took matters into their own hands so to speak. One such individual appears to have lived in Bergen, New York (roughly 20 miles southwest of Rochester) in Genesee County.

Not many details are known about these items, but they were probably used about 1856 (plus or minus one year). One of the covers pictured (Illustrations on page 3) is docketed "1852), but this cannot be correct based on the plate position and color of the stamp. No doubt this docketing was applied years later. The covers are known addressed to several different people in different handwritings.

The purpose of this request is to ask for help in gathering information for part of a study on perforation of postage stamps in the United States and specifically to ask for help on several fronts.

Do any members have additional copies of the "sawtooth" separation used from Bergen. A census of known items, on and off cover is being compiled, and a photocopy of your item would be appreciated.

Can members provide examples of the same Bergen, NY cancellation on stamps from the 1850's that do not show the sawtooth separations? Such examples might be helpful in establishing if it was the postmaster or a private citizen who applied the sawtooth separations. Additionally, such examples might help establish the year of usage, if accompanied by letters, docketing or the like.

Can members provide any other details on the items, perhaps the result of other articles or other research?

This is also of interest to the writer (John Lange) who has two extensive studies of the 3¢ 1851-57 imperforate stamp. Private perforations on the imperforate stamp fit nicely in these studies. Responses will be appreciated and may be sent either to the writer or to Mr. Hulme. We coordinate!





A LOOK BACKWARD

Scanning some recent dealer prices and auction realizations makes an old-time collector of New York State postal markings on cover admit, indeed, times have changed. No longer are important "finds" being made. No longer can one assemble a representative showing of statewide 18th and 19th century material at a cost the average working stiff might prudently spend on his or her hobby. Inflation, steady collector demand and the interesting historical data uncovered in old correspondence have each contributed to the spectacular rise in value, over the past 30-40 years, of even the most common cover. Add to these factors the specializing or "narrowing down" by collecting only a particular region, county, city or village. Then add in such topical themes are railroad, steamboat, express and similar special service markings which elevate the demand for (read cost of) that specialty.

But the major reason for appreciation in value is, in my opinion, the time proven law of supply and demand as more and more collectors turn to postal history and chase a dwindling supply of collectible material. There are no large finds being made today.

I was reminded of this when a price list of the late Ward Hinman turned up in a box of odds and ends I was sorting. Ward Hinman was an early member of the Albany Fort Orange Stamp Club and the first genuine postal history student I ever knew. He was a cover collector at a time when this pursuit was not a major part of philately, except for those gems carrying valuable stamps. By day he was chief engineer in the telephone division of the New York State Public Service Commission. By night he was a postal history sleuth. His daytime work involved digging out facts and statistics for presentation at telephone rate cases and his position gave him ready access to New York State Library archives which few collectors knew existed. He was thus ideally trained for his postal history research activities. At stamp club meetings he freely exchanged his findings with other members interested in this new aspect of the hobby.

When Hinman came into possession of a portion of the massive correspondence in the New York City "Seth Low" find he spotted letters relating to the 1836-39 triple rate express and was the first writer to publish, in STAMPS magazine, the discover of this historic step by the Post Office Department to provide fast, efficient mail service in competition with the private expresses. Dr. James W. Milgram is today's authority on this service, having collected and written extensively on the subject. Hinman's fine 1836-39 express collection was eventually purchased by another pioneer postal historian, Philip Ward of Philadelphia.

Several other large finds made in the Capital District were shared with Hinman. He had the opportunity to extract important material from the State Comptroller and Townsend hoards and had a hand in breaking down the Cooperstown Bank find. Eventually his holdings outran his research time and he began to sell the less interesting material.

Hinman offered items singly and in bundles to dealers who were beginning to recognize their worth and issued several price lists to New York State collectors. The one I have is undated, it is probably from the mid-30s and certainly represents his disposal of unwanted State Comptroller correspondence. The Comptroller material now resting in our collections was fortunately rescued from destruction by pure change—but that is another story

Here is a sampling of Hinman's price list. It is closely typed, 40-50 lines to the page on thirteen $8\ 1/2\ x$ 11 mimeographed sheets. Remember the mimeograph — or it that too long ago? What a black sticky mess!

Note: Unless otherwise shown all strikes are circular. On the original listing no precise description was given for size, upper and lower case letter or if all capitals, no indication of placement for periods, commas, etc.

POSTAL HISTORY RESEARCH

This past summer your editor spent a good deal of time in the Special Collections at the State University in Plattsburgh researching the post offices of Essex County. I mention this because there are two very good sources for postal history in the Special Collections.

One untapped (philatelically) source is the Pliny Moore collection. This is "gold mine". Pliny Moore was one of the original settlers of Clinton County in the 1780s. His correspondence (about 1787-1820) (and type written copies) is available for research. I found a number of dates earlier than those listing in *Manuscript Post Offices of New York State*.

Many researchers have studied these letters from an historical and social point of view. However, since Judge Moore was the first postmaster of Champlaintown (1797), many letters deal with postal matters.

Also, in the special collections is the philatelic research of Robert F. Hale of Malone, who died in the mid-1960s before he had an opportunity to arrange and publish his findings. Mr. Hale was interested in St. Lawrence, Franklin, Essex and Clinton Counties.

Also listed in the holdings were 89 ALS (autographed letter sheets) from the Keese family. The Keese were the founders and first postmasters of Keeseville, a village in the town of Chesterfield in Essex County. This collection awaits another visit from the author. It seems that some local historic holdings can be the source of unrecorded philatelic material.

If you are in the Champlain Valley during September and the first part of October, try not to miss the postal exhibit in the Chimney Point historic site opposite the light house at the Fort Crown Point. The site's theme for the summer is postal history of Addison County, Vermont.

If you are in the Lake Placid area on September 30, you should plan to attend the first day ceremonies for the 1995 Traditional Christmas stamps which will be held at North Pole, NY. North Pole is a station of the Lake Placid post office. The North Pole itself is a theme park on the Whiteface Mountain Highway in Wilmington, NY about 12 miles from Lake Placid. The first day ceremonies will the held at the theme park. I hope to see some fellow ESPHS members there.
