PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: Fall Meeting at STEPEX 2000

Although the turnout was light, the spirit was strong. Saturday at 3:30 pm. at a stamp show in Horseheads is probably not the best time and place to schedule a Society meeting but we were still able to get a quorum. If the meeting had been earlier in the day, attendance would have improved.

The first order of business was to present the ESPHS award for the best New York Postal History exhibit at STEPEX 2000 to our Secretary-Treasurer, John Lange, for his exhibit, "The Ballstons, Postal History in the Stampless Period". This is an excellent four-frame (64 pages) exhibit and I hope it will be shown again for more members to study and appreciate.

Significant items of business transacted at the meeting included approval of our publication of Charles Sweeting's new book "Oswego County, New York, Postal History", authorization of a "fire sale" of excess Society publications, appointment of John Cali as chair of the Nominating Committee and his agreement to serve, initial delivery of the 1931 New York Postal Route Map offered gratis to those Society members requesting them, and approval of an ESPHS life membership dues schedule. Further details can be found elsewhere in this *Bulletin*.

At the close of the meeting, one of the members attending, Fred Dykins of Elmira, became our first paid life member. Thank you, Fred.

Subsequent to the fall meeting John Cali enlisted Gerald Wiley and Charles Sweeting to serve on the Nominating Committee with him. My thanks to John and the members of his committee.

One unfortunate casualty of the low turnout at the meeting was the annual Kenneth R. deLisle four-page exhibit competition. The lone entry, John Lange's "Saratoga County Post Offices with Corners", will be ready for the fall meeting in 2001. John enjoys the challenge of competition; please don't disappoint him in 2001.

Save Saturday, February 17, 2001 for a regional meeting at Cover Mania #3 in the Albany Area, and Sunday, May 6, for the Society's annual meeting at the Casa Mia in Canastota. Further details on Cover Mania #3 will be coming by postcard (and Internet?) to each member.

While Society meetings are enjoyable and give us an opportunity to transact necessary business, don't forget that a good deal of effort goes on behind the scenes and needs support and input from our members. Charles Sweeting is looking for further input on Oswego County postal history, Doug Penwell on New York manuscript post office dates, Maris Tirums on New York Doane cancels (see his article in the September *Bulletin*), and David Williams on New York State star cancels (update of the Proulx book). Our Auction manager, Bill Hart, is in need of consignments, and our *Journal* and *Bulletin* editors, Martin Margulis and Glenn Estus, are always happy to receive contributions to their respective publications.

Thanks again to John Lange for his thorough fall meeting preparations and thanks to those who attended. May the holidays be pleasant for all, and the new year full of success in your philatelic pursuits.

Combined Executive Board and Membership Meeting **STEPEX 2000** Horseheads, NY 10/21/00

Quorums for the Executive Board and membership meeting were verified by the Secretary.

1. Awards Committee (Guenzburger): The best NY Postal History exhibit award for STEPEX 2000 was presented by Albert to John Lange for "The Ballstons, Postal History in the Stampless Period."

2. E-mail addresses (Parsons): Ongoing investigation; Ada Prill noted that some e-mail addresses

can only receive text, not graphics.

3. Proposal from Charles Sweeting for ESPHS sponsorship of his nearly completed book

"Oswego County, NY Postal History".

- a. A cost analysis had been prepared by John Lange using input from Charles Sweeting and expected paper/printing cost. This was reviewed prior to the meeting by the Finance Committee of Lange/Parsons/Tirums and approved. Based on a proposed quantity of 102 (the same as the Cayuga Co. book), the expected cost/book sold is expected to be between \$24.20 and \$26.22. The list price will be \$40.00, the ESPHS members' discounted price will be \$32.00 and the price to buyers of five or more will be \$24.00. The already achieved profit on the Cayuga Co. book of over \$500.00 justifies any loss in sales to bookstores as the objective is to provide wide
- b. John Lange requested approval to purchase 44 reams of the 28 lb paper at a cost of \$483.12 which is on sale now, but will not be at that price when the book is printed. c. Board/Membership approval for a) and b) preceding granted.

4. Proposed scrapping of "excess" ESPHS publications:

a. Co. & PM cancels, Proulx, Have 208. Sold 2 last year and 1 this year. Secretary would like to reduce quantity to 20 (storage problem)

b. MSPO 1984 ed. originals. Have 204, sold 17 last year including supplements. Sold only one this year. Propose reducing quantity to 20. (storage problem).

c. White 3-ring binders, have 27. These were purchased for Bernadt's book.

d. Resolution on items a) and b) was to first advertise these in the Bulletin as a very low price, say \$1.00-\$2.00 and if that doesn't move them, to offer to dealer's at a clearance price, then scrap remainders. Resolution on the white 3-ring binders was a suggestion to Lange to bring them to the Spring meeting and offer them for sale at \$2.00

5. Nominating committee for May 2001 elections. John Cali, Chairman. Cali will select other members, but anyone who is willing to serve on that committee should contact John.

Positions Open: President two years (03); Incumbent: Alan Parsons Vice President: two years (03); incumbent: Joseph Rowbottom

Three Directors (04), Incumbents: Drew Nicholson, John Nunes, and Stephen Matte.

6. Location of May 2001 meeting (Parsons). Probably Canastota.

7. Auction Manager Input (Bill Hart). Bill was unable to leave his dealer's booth but relayed the word that he really needs material.

8 Postal Route Maps, 1931 ed. Charles Sweeting really deserves some applause for his efforts here. He made three trips to Syracuse to have them printed, convinced the printer to donate the mailing tubes, took them home and with his wife's help, rolled them up, stuffed them into the tubes sealed both ends and then transported them in two carloads to John Lange. Anyway, 15 copies were distributed **free** to members at STEPEX 2000. List price is \$15.00, additional copies are \$7.00 to ESPHS members, \$8.00 to the MPOS (Lou Call to take the initiative here). A discount of 40% from list, i.e. a price of \$9.00 will be given to buyers of 5 or more. All these prices are postage paid and will be mailed in mailing tubes by John Lange.

9. LIPHS proposed merger with the ESPHS. This has not yet taken place. We are awaiting a response from the LIPHS treasurer, Martin Koenig, to Alan Parsons' questions of April 14, 2000. A copy was sent to Mr. Koenig on October 3, 2000. John Cali of the ESPHS has also

offered to do some investigating.

10. Life Membership (Lange). Item 14 of the June 2000 minutes noted that this subject was tabled pending further study by the Treasurer. That study has now been completed and presented to the Finance Committee of the Executive Board for approval. Computations were made to determine the length of time that it would take for a given amount of money to deplete itself, given three factors:

a) the current cost of servicing each member is \$8.20

b) an assumed inflation rate of 3%

c) an assumed inflation rate of 4%

Calculations were done for sums of \$100, \$120, and \$150. Based on a plot of those results and a discussion as to whether a Life membership would be a flat fee or a graduated amount depending on age, the following table was arrived at by the Finance Committee and approved by the Executive Board and the members present:

Age 65 and over ----\$100 Ages 51-64-----\$150 Ages 40-50----\$200 Ages 39 and under---\$225

One of the members present, Fred Dykins, took advantage of the opportunity and when the meeting was adjourned, became our first Paid Life Member with his check of \$100.

1931 NEW YORK POST ROUTE MAP AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS AT NO CHARGE

The Post Office Department's 1931 NYS Post Route Map described in the September *Bulletins* will be given free to Society members requesting a copy. The map, in two sections each measuring approximately 27" x 50", is entitled "Post Route Map of the State of New York Showing Post Offices with the Intermediate Distances on Mail Routes in Operation on the 1st of January 1931". The map is an invaluable reference source for postal history collectors seeking to understand mail routes during the 1920s and 1930s.

The request for the map should be made by postal card directed to our Secretary/Treasurer, whose address is on the second page of this *Bulletin*.

Additional sets are available to ESPHS members at \$7.00 each.

The map sections are not folded, but rolled and placed in a mailing tube about 37 inches long. Tt will be mailed book rate.

Bidders' Rules

The auction is presented in two parts - the first having scarcer or better material and the latter with more common material.

Part 1: All of the better material will be identified with minimum bids established by the owner. The minimums start at \$10. These lots will have detailed descriptions

Part 2: All of the more common material will have a one line description and require a starting bid of \$2. This group will have no lot reserves but some lots may be given estimated values.

Sale will be at one increment over second highest bid. Tie bids go to the earliest bidder by mail or phone. The latter must be confirmed by mail. Bidding increments are \$.50 up to \$10, \$1 from \$10 to \$40, \$2.50 from \$40 to \$100 and \$5 over \$100.

Payment is expected to be sent within 5 days after receipt of lots, should be made out to E.S.P.H.S. and sent to Box 167, Shrub Oak, NY 10588.

Photocopies will be sent at \$.10 per lot and an SASE. No copies of lots with more than three items. Incorrectly described material may be returned within 5 days. This is exclusive of condition, which will be described to the best of the auctioneer's ability. Relatively little postal history is pristine. No returns on lots containing more than 3 items.

NYS PH EXHIBITS AT STEPEX 2000

Six of the 24 exhibits at STEPEX 2000, held at the Arnot Mall, Horseheads, N.Y. October 20-21 dealt with some aspect of New York Postal History. In terms of number of exhibits, it was the best showing in recent memory.

Receiving both STEPEX Gold and the ESPHS award for the best New York postal history exhibit at STEPEX was John Lange's "The Ballstons, Postal History in the Stampless Period", a masterful four-frame display of stampless covers from a significant segment of Saratoga County.

John received his ESPHS award, a Waterford Crystal clock, at the Society's fall meeting from Albert Guenzburger, Chairman of the Society's Awards Committee.

Other STEPEX golds for New York postal history exhibits were awarded to Martin Margulis for "A Survey of Staten Island (Richmond Co.) Postal History", to Ada Prill for "Star Cancels of Delaware County, New York", a one-frame exhibit and Ada's first exhibit, and to Alan Parsons for "19th Century Railroad Postal Markings Related to Steuben, Schuyler, Chemung, and Tioga Counties", a two-frame exhibit.

The judges awarded STEPEX silvers to Bill Hart's one-frame exhibit on "New York State Rural Free Delivery Hand Cancels" and Norm Wright's "Selected Rochester [NY] Rail Mail", a two-framer.

Judges for STEPEX were Maris Tirums, Albert Guenzburger, and Raymond Stone.

Society members are strongly urged to exhibit their New York postal history at an upcoming New York State Show. Three excellent shows take place within the next six months: ROPEX in Rochester, March 16-18, BUFPEX in Buffalo, March 30-April 1, and the MEGA Event in New York City, March 29-April 1. Both the Rochester and New York City show are WSP shows. ROPEX filled all its exhibition frames by Dec. 1st. RARE NY FLAG SELLS FOR \$3,125.00

A Poughkeepsie, New York/Military Branch flag machine cancel on a YMCA cover more than doubled a presale estimate of \$1,500.00 in Jim Mehrer's Postal History Mail Bid Sale #40 which closed on May 2, 2000. The cover sold for \$3,125.00. Many U.S. military branches used American Flag machines during the World War I era, and most of these types are fairly common. However, this example of Langford Type A38, dated July 17, 1917, remains the only reported flag cancel from the Poughkeepsie Military Branch. (*Thanks to Jim Mehrer for this information. BASS--JEFFERSON COUNTY



The eastern section of Lake Ontario has long been recognized as an excellent fishing area.

Campbells Point, located on Henderson Bay three miles from Sackets Harbor, was the site of Campbells Point Hotel. The hotel, in an advertisement enclosed in the cover shown below, claimed the best bass fishing in Northern New York. It also had steamer connection with New York Central trains at Sackets Harbor and telegraph and a post office. When the post office was established in 1899 the name Campbell was unavailable. An office by that name was already located in Steuben County.

The new post office was given the most appropriated name of BASS, with Alton D. Green as postmaster.

The BASS post office was discontinued as of April 30, 1092, having been in operation for only three years.

Juliana, Stueben County? or Oswego County?

"Smith and Kay" said it just right on page 8: "One must remember that many of the records used were handwritten and errors could occur in reading and transcription." Also one can surmise that at times, the working conditions (time pressure, temperature, and lightning conditions) lead to errors.

Smith and Kay list Juliana as a Steuben County post office between Feb. 21, 1822 and July 29, 1823.

However, The Spafford Gazetteer (of the State of New York) of 1824 has the following:

pg. 259: Juliana: a POST OFFICE - See Mexico

pg. 315: Mexico: a POST TOWNSHIP of Oswego County, 20 miles E of Oswego, 10 S. of Pulaski, bounded N.W. on Lake Ontario...It is in contemplation to erect a new TOWN, of the 23rd township, in which a correspondent writes me there is lately established "Juliana POST OFFICE", on the N. branch of the Little Salmon River, near Mary's Lake.....

pg. 615 in a list of POST-OFFICES (Jan. 1, 1824): Juliana, MEXICO, Oswego-15-147-425 which indicates Juliana as being in the town of MEXICO, 15 miles from the county seat of OSWEGO, 147 miles from ALBANY, and 425 miles from WASHINGTON, D.C. by post routes.

An insert map has on it JULIANA located in the NE part of Oswego

The result is that collectors of Stueben County have an answer to the question--Where was it located? The answer: it was actually located in Oswego County.
