CLIFFORD E. TUTTLE, 1917-2002

Cliff Tuttle, a staunch friend and longtime active participant in the affairs of ESPHS, passed away at his home in Sidney, NY, January 22 following a long illness. He was 84.

Cliff collected the postal history of Delaware and Sullivan Counties. He was an active exhibitor and served as a judge for shows sponsored by clubs belonging to the Federation of Central NY Philatelic Societies. In his role as judge he became well-known and well-liked among stamp collectors in upstate NY.

For many years Cliff was vice-president of ESPHS and served the Society with distinction, handling membership duties and the awards program. He also authored articles for ESPHS publications.

In addition to postal history, Cliff had a strong interest in U.S. postal stationery. He was as active and knowledgeable in this field as he was in the postal history field.

Last but not least, Cliff was a huge contributor to the Tri-County Stamp club in Sidney and would have been in the thick of CINCOPEX there last fall if his health had permitted. He is survived by two children and their families. He wife, Evelyn, died in 1995. Memorial contributions may be directed to Catskill Area Hospice, 542 Main St., Oneonta, NY 13820. He was a good friend and surely will be missed.

Minutes of Annual Meeting, May 5, 2002 at Graziano's Casa Mia 5/9/02

Restaurant, Canastota, NY:

Present: Directors Cali, Guenzburger, Lange, Nunes, Parsons, Rowbottom, Tirums, Wiley and members Christofaro, Hart, C. & H. Sweeting. There was a quorum for the combination executive board and annual meetings.

- 1. Secretary/Treasurer's Report: Read by John Lange and summarized at the end of these minutes. Approved.
- 2. Auction Manager's Report: John Nunes reported positive feedback relative to his first auction. Photos of all lots were perceived as a plus. Sale #107 income was \$677.00 with a net to ESPHS of \$30.35. There were four consignors and 14 successful buyers. Members are urged to submit lots for the next auction. In the future, John suggested the possibility of the auction lots being on the web.
- 3. Federation of Central NY Philatelic Societies: Delegates Lange & Rowbottom were appointed.
- 4. Awards:
- 4.1 President Parsons announced that the Whittlesey Award for an outstanding philatelic book, The Postal History of Oswego County by Charles and Heather Sweeting will be presented to Heather at the fall ESPHS meeting.
- 4.2 Awards Chairman Alfred Guenzburger noted that awards had been given at Cincopex 2001 (John Lange), Stepex 2001 (Martin Margulis) and Ropex 2001 (Bill Bauer). Also 18 frames of ESPHS entries have been entered for the May 25 competition at NOJEX. The ESPHS has allocated \$100 for this first tri-state competition (PA, NJ & NY) and John Nunes has personally offered \$100 but it is not presently known whether these offers will be accepted. Guenzburger suggested the 02/03 budget for awards be increased to \$700 (actual number revised to \$800).
- 5. Stamp Insider assignments:

6. Publications:

Thanks to Glenn Estus (Bulletin Editor) and to Martin Margulis (journal Editor) for their appreciated contributions. Langenoted that the Bulletin would continue to be printed using 20 lb. paper (2c/sheet) and the Journal would be printed using 28 lb paper (the Sweeting books paper, 2 1/2c - 3c /sheet).

- 6.1 Cayuga Co. PH book (Charles Sweeting, author). A success; 23 copies left from printing of 102 with cost of \$1559.63 and revenues of \$2411.03
- 6.2 Oswego Co. PH book (Charles and Heather Sweeting, authors) Another success. Two books left from printing of 102, with cost of \$1880.06 and revenues of \$2825.78.
- 6.3 Williams, Star Cancel book actively working per Parsons.
- 6.4 Penwell, MSPO Revision & Co. & PM book revisions, in process per Parsons.
- 6.5 Hart, RFD cancels. Bill gave a summary of how his writings are organized and the

period covered. Help from Walter Laforce is appreciated. Publication not envisioned for the 02/03 year. Bill was asked to submit a short article to the Bulletin editor, Glenn Estus, which would summarize his project and note the input that he would want from ESPHS members.

- 6.6 Doane cancel book for NYS, Maris Tirums author; Maris has submitted material to the National coordinator, but ESPHS still intends to publish a manuscript for NYS. Maris is continuing to receive new data. Publication during the 02/03 year is anticipated in the approved budget.
- 7. Excess Publication, inventory disposal.: Lange, stated that he has a 5-20 year supply; exclusive of that, John Cali has several cartons of material which he has the authority to dispose of as the occasions arise for the advancement of philately. Cristofaro proposed donation of 2 copies each to the Federation library. Approved; this is a typical worthy donation. Secretary Lange was also authorized to donate 2 copies of the Federal PO. of NYS to the Federation (through Cali).
- 8. Proposed Budget for 2002-2003. Approved, subject to changing the Awards portion to \$800.
- 9. Election of officers/directors: John Cali, chairman of the nominating committee, read the following slate which was approved.

- 10. Alfred Guenzburger stated that the Constitutionally mandated meeting date of the first Sunday in May conflicts with the Boxborough show in Massachusetts. He would like to have more flexibility in the date. A specific proposal from Guenzburger with the language changes needed would be acted on by the Board. Alan Parsons stated that this could be combined with a move to incorporate the Society.
- 11. Treasurer's Report for 2001-2002: This is a summary; a full report, as presented to the finance committee, the Executive Board and the membership at the annual meeting on May 5, 2002 is available from John Lange upon request.
- 12. Fall meeting:Sunday, Oct. 13, 2002, 1:30-3pm, Turning Stone Casino, Verona, NY. at the Central New York Stamp and Cover Show hosted by the FT. Stanwix and Utica Stamp Clubs.

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WHITTLESEY AWARD TO HEATHER SWEETING

The Whittlesey Award, resulting from a bequest to the Society by the late John S. Whittlesey, recognizes significant original contributions to the literature of New York postal history. At the annual meeting in May it was announced that the standing committee on the Whittlesey Award, consisting of Al Parsons and Bill Bauer, had decided to present the award for 2001 and determined it should go to Heather L. Sweeting, co-author, with her father, Charles H. Sweeting, of *Oswego County NY Postal History*, published by the Society last year.

Heather is a music educator in the Oswego School District and started collecting stamps in grade school. Among her collecting interests are Cayuga County NY precancels, and postcards depicting NY State post offices. She lives in Sterling, NY.

Since its inception in 1997, the Whittlesey Award has been presented only once previously, to wit, in 1999 to Charles H. Sweeting for his 1998 book, 200 Years of Cayuga County, NY Postal History.

The award, consisting of an appropriately inscribed book and plaque, will be presented to Heather at the Society's fall meeting in Verona, NY.

BILL BAUER WINS ESPHS AWARD AT ROPEX 2002; REGIONAL MEETING HELD

Four New York postal history exhibits competed for the ESPHS award at ROPEX 2002, the National Stamp Show held in Rochester March 8-10: Bill Bauer's Otsego County, NY (Vermeil), Tom Post's New York & Chicago Railway Post Office (Silver), Bill Hart's single-frame New York State RFD Hand Cancels (Silver) and Ray Stone's 3 cent Handcar – Rochester's First Transportation Coil (Silver).

For the best exhibit of NY postal history at ROPEX 2002 earning a National Vermeil or better, Bill Bauer received the Society's award, a Waterford bowl, at the ROPEX banquet.

The Show Program had the following description of Bauer's 10-frame exhibit: "U.S. postal history as documented on the mail of Otsego County through townmarks, rates, services and uses." Congratulations to Bill for an excellent exhibit.

Eleven members of the Society—Ada Prill, Lou Call, Tom Post, Al Guenzburger, Tom Mazza, Bill Bauer, Bill Hart, Walter LaForce, Drew Nicholson, John Cali and Al Parsons—joined for an informal get together on Saturday at ROPEX. The discussion touched on many aspects of Society programs, both current and projected, and on various resources for postal historians such as the new Helbock book listing all U.S. Post Offices and their dates of existence in the nine states comprising the Northeast. The presence of Tom Post, President of the Mobile Post Office Society, reminded the group that postal history collectors need to be familiar with the work of numerous specialist societies researching and publishing in their own fields of postal history.

FALL MEETING AT CNYSCS 2002 OCTOBER 13

Our fall meeting will be held in conjunction with the Central New York Stamp and Cover Show 2002 (CNYSCS) at Turning Stone Casino and Conference Center, Rt.365, Verona, NY, exit 33 off the NY Thruway. The Show will take place on Saturday and Sunday, October 12 and 13, 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. We will meet on Sunday in the Conference Center from 1:30 to 3 p.m.

Jointly sponsored by the Fort Stanwix (Rome, NY) and Utica Stamp Clubs, CNYSCS 2002 will include competitive exhibits, a 25 dealer bourse, show cachets and cancellation, USPS booth, door prizes and free admission and parking.

xhibits are now being sought for CNYSCS 2002 and Society members are strongly urged to enter NY postal history exhibits at this show and at STEPEX 2002 in Horseheads, NY October 18 and 19. If exhibiting information and entry forms for these shows are not included with this *Bulletin*, they can be obtained by contacting John Cali, P.O.Box 401, Fulton, NY 13069, (315) 592-4441, e-mail: rocket@dreamscape.com (for CNYSCS 2002), and Alan Parsons, 809 Holley Rd., Elmira, NY 14905, (607) 732-0181, e-mail: alatholleyrd@aol.com (for STEPEX 2002). If sufficient NY postal history exhibits are received, each show can qualify for an ESPHS Waterford Crystal exhibiting award.

One of the features of our fall meeting will be the annual *Kenneth R. deLisle Award* competition. Members are encouraged to bring four pages of connected material relating to postal operations in NY State. The pages will be laid out on a table for viewing, with the winner to be selected by ballot of those in attendance at the meeting.

At the 2001 fall meeting two entries were received for the *deLisle Award* competition. The balloting resulted in a tie, and the award was not given. Hopefully, those same two entries will be the nucleus for a much enlarged competition this year. The *deLisle Award* is a handsome walnut plaque outline of NY State, suitably engraved, and will be given to the 2002 winner at the 2003 annual meeting. It's a great opportunity to show an interesting or colorful aspect of NY postal history from your collection!

Joseph Call, the Lewis Giant

One of the more famous early Adirondack natives was Joseph Call, or as he is more commonly known, Joe Call, the Lewis Giant.

According to Kay and Smith, Joseph Call was the first postmaster of both Callsville (Franklin County) and Pineville (Essex County). Pineville operated from December 29, 1828 and September 7, 1829 while Callsville was a post office between April 3, 1833 and October 21, 1834.

In local lore, Call was called the Lewis Giant because he was so tall, so massive, and so strong!

Contrary to the listing in Kay and Smith, many local Adirondack historians have assumed that Callsville was in the town of Lewis where Joe Call lived a good part of his adult life. Indeed, most historians have no knowledge that there was ever a post office called Pineville in Essex County.

In his work, "Joe Call, the Lewis Giant", Maitland Desormo writes that Callsville was located where exit 32 of the Adirondack Northway (Interstate 87) was built in 1966. This view has been accepted by most local historians. This has been further reinforced by another document found in the Essex County Clerk's office which shows a receipt from the postmaster of Westport, C.B. Hatch, to the estate of Joseph Call settling the accounts at Callsville. It seems that these historians have assumed that since Joe Call was a postmaster of a small post office in the early Town of Lewis and since his estate settled with the Post Office department his Callsville account, that it would follow that Callsville must have been the name of the post office in the Town of Lewis.


However, Burr's map of 1839 shows Callsville on the road from Ausable Forks (Clinton County) to Malone (Franklin County). The location is definitely inside Franklin County. I make the assumption that the Post Office Department records and Burr, being contemporary of Joe Call would have the right information, i.e. that Callsville was located in Franklin County. Therefore, could we also make another leap of faith and perhaps tentatively identify Call's post office in the Town of Lewis as being Pineville?

I have searched county records, historical records, and postal records for the definite location of Pineville for the last decade to no avail.


In Postage Accruing in the Year 1834 (ending March 31, 1834) "Letter from the Postmaster General (2/27/1835)" written to the 23rd Congress, 2nd Session Doc. No. 176, Callsville is noted as having \$3.94 in income for 1833.

Covers from these two post offices must be extremely scarce or non-existent. There are no examples recorded in the Stampless Cover catalog or in Manuscript Listings by Chlanda and Wilcox and Penwell.
