#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Although I am obviously biased, I would have to declare our annual meeting at Canastota May 4 an unqualified success. All but one of the Society's elected officers were present, joined by four others (also contributors), for a total of 15, a 25% increase over last year! Thanks to all who attended, especially Joe Rowbottom for making the meeting arrangements, John Nunes for providing all-important cover-hunting and John Lange, our Secretary-Treasurer, for necessary meeting structure and reports.

As John Lange's minutes elsewhere in this *Bulletin* will show, reports were received from John Nunes, Al Guenzburger, Maris Tirums, John Cali and Drew Nicholson, and I am grateful for these meeting contributions as well.

Joe Rowbottom and I were elected to new two-year terms as your Vice-President and President, respectively, along with new three-year terms for continuing Board members Albert Guenzburger and Maris Tirums, and new Board member William J. Hart. Bill Hart is no stranger to the Board, having served as President as well as a director of the Society. He replaces Jack Haefli, who retires after many years of service as an officer, author, committee chair and editor. Although Jack had not been active in recent years, his contributions to the Society prior to that time were numerous and significant.

A sad note at the meeting was the report by John Nunes of George Bernadt's death just a few days before. John had visited George at the hospital shortly before he died. Others at the meeting spoke of George's many contributions to the Society. While he was still able to travel George never missed an annual meeting, and, in spite of declining health, attended our regional meeting in Albany Feb.16. I was delighted to see him there.

I was pleased to report on the large number of Society exhibitors scheduled for ROPEX June 20-22, but not pleased to report on the low response (just one single-frame exhibit) to the invitations I sent out in late January for a second multi-state postal history exhibiting competition to follow the first at NOJEX in May 2002. The invitations should have been mailed earlier, and I apologize to those exhibitors who responded to the requests made in last year's *Bulletins* for a good ESPHS showing in this year's competition. There will be at least a resemblance of multi-state competition in the single-frame category, but hardly enough to give the "winning" society bragging rights.

There will be both multi-frame and single-frame ESPHS awards (Waterford clocks) at ROPEX, with the single-frame award recognizing the best in the multi-state competition existing in the single-frame category. The dutch-treat dinner Friday evening at a local restaurant for members of postal history societies participating at ROPEX will still be held. Those interested please check at the show entrance for time, restaurant, directions, ride-sharing, etc



## Empire State Postal History Society Annual Meeting, May 4, 2003 Graziano's Casa Mia Restaurant, Canastota, NY

Present: President Parsons, Vice President Rowbottom, Secretary/Treasurer Lange, Directors Cali, Call, Guenzburger, Nicholson, Nunes, H. Sweeting, Tirums and Wiley with members Bauer, Resnick, C. Sweeting, Todaro, 15 total with quorums for both the Officers/Directors and general membership.

1. It was announced that George Bernadt had passed away the previous week. John Nunes, Alan Parsons, John Lange and Maris Tirums spoke of George's contributions to philately and the ESPHS among them being President of the ESPHS, the Fort Orange Stamp Club, the Schenectady Stamp Club, our ESPHS auction manager for many years and most importantly his 1993 authorship of the book "Postal Markings of New York State, 1792-1856, a truly pioneering work.

The death of Kenneth Shuker was also announced.

A moment of silence was observed for both.

2. Treasurer's Report for 2002-2003: Presented by John Lange, Secretary/Treasurer. This consists of 3 pages and is an addendum to these minutes. Reviewed and approved prior to the meeting by Finance Committee members Parsons and Tirums. There are no debts; our assets are \$34,954.28 consisting of \$19,852.03 in 5 year CD's, \$10,464.41 in money market funds, \$4104.80 in a bond fund and \$533.04 in two checking accounts. Interest and capital gain during the year was \$1,512.94. This interest is the vehicle that we use to keep our dues at such a modest figure. There was a net change of plus \$247.46 from last year which can be attributed to the gain of three more life members. Lange stated that the \$6,863.28 in a T. Rowe Price MM fund would be transferred to the T.R.P. Spectrum Income Fund, a change from 0.69% yield to 4.59%. This will be done the following week. (Done)

Proposed Budget for 2003-2004: Presented by John Lange at the end of the meeting. Previously approved by the Finance Committee; approved by those present. This is page 4 of the Report. Total Revenues are estimated at \$2,965 and expenditures at \$3,450. The expenditures include \$700 for Awards and \$500 as seed money for new publications.

- 3. Auction Manager's input (John Nunes): Four successful auctions with a net of \$131.04. Our object is not to make money but to make material available to members. The use of illustrations has been well received. John always needs more material (you Long Island collectors, send us your surplus LI covers, they'll sell!)
- 4. Awards Committee input (Albert Guenzburger): It was a busy year; awards at Stepex, Cincopex, Buffpex and Nojex. Albert proposed small clocks at local shows, larger clocks or bowls at major shows. This sounded fine; Al should use his own discretion for the types of awards His program is attracting more exhibitors.

- d. Star cancel revision proposed by David Williams no news
- e.1931 Postal Route maps; still available, one free to ESPHS members
- f.Doane Cancels (Tirums): Active, still working on it, last year

provided Helbock with an update; has received several hundred new listings since then and has all data on computer; publishing date indefinite.

g.MSPO combining original, master supplement + new data (Penwell): Penwell wishes he would get more input from our members (reminders in our Bulletins would help). A letter has been sent by the Secretary to Penwell urging continuation of the project.

h.RFD book (Hart): Parsons stated that Hart's work is continuing but has had no recent status update.

i.Bulletin (Glen Estus): The Bulletins are produced in a timely fashion, are well edited and a publication to be proud of. Thanks, Glenn

j.Journal: Martin Margulis is thanked for his efforts in producing the Journal for many years. Our new editor, starting with the Fall (Sept.) issue will be Drew Nicholson who advises that he needs articles from members to start off his first Journal. Please send; he prefers the loan of original covers so that he can provide the best reproductions. (Treasurer's note:-- ESPHS will provide complete registration/insured mail cost reimbursement.)

Note: If you have your article on pages intended for exhibit, Drew would like to use them. An introduction is needed because that isn't included with an exhibit. Also Drew announced that the September Journal would start with a new numbering system. Send proposed articles to:

7. ROPEX 2003/2004 competitions: President Parsons announced that the proposal for a multistate exhibiting competition at ROPEX 2003 had produced good response from ESPHS members (seven exhibits, 28 frames) but only one single-frame exhibit from the other state

postal history societies receiving invitations (NJ, PA, VT, MA). He felt the lack of interest from the other societies might be due to the fact the invitations to them did not go out until late January, which didn't give them sufficient lead time for promoting the competition in their respective publications (a multi-frame NJ postal history exhibit was offered in late March, but at that point the ROPEX frames were filled). He apologized to the Society exhibitors who had responded to the publicity for this competition in the Sept. and Dec. '02 Bulletins and proposed that the Society try again for ROPEX in June 2004, with the invitations to be sent no later than August 31, 2003. This proposal was approved.

Since the eight postal history exhibits at ROPEX 2003 will be evenly divided between multiframe and single frame exhibits, it was felt there should be an ESPHS award for both categories and this too, was approved for both 2003 and 2004 competitions.

8. Kenneth R. de Lisle Award for best 4 page presentation at the Fall 2002 ESPHS meeting: The award, an engraved plaque in the shape of New York State was presented to Alan Parsons for his showing of "PRISONER'S MAIL, Elmira NY Civil War Prison Camp, 1864-65." The presentation was by Albert Guenzburger, our Awards Chairman.

Reminder: This fall, bring four pages (need not be mounted in a frame) of NY postal history. There are no rules and a popularity vote will be taken by those present.

- 9. Location for fall meeting: Syrapex, Syracuse, NY. Holiday Inn at Carrier Circle, College Drive & Court St, East Syracuse. Sunday, Nov. 9, 2003. John Cali will be our contact with the Syracuse Stamp Club to arrange for a meeting room, listing in the show program, etc..
- 10. Election of officers: Alan Parsons, President, Joseph Rowbottom, Vice President, both 2003-2005; Directors Albert Guenzburger, William Hart and Maris Tirums all 2003-2006. Nominations were provided to the Secretary by John Cali, Nomination Committee Chairman in compliance with Constitution/ Bylaws requirements. Elected.



## FALL MEETING IN SYRACUSE NOVEMBER 9; EXHIBITS NEEDED FOR OCTOBER/NOVEMBER SHOWS

ESPHS will hold its 2003 fall meeting in conjunction with SYRAPEX '03 at Holiday Inn at Carrier Circle, College Drive and Court Street, East Syracuse, November 8 and 9.

Barring a conflict with other events scheduled for the show, the ESPHS meeting will be held on Sunday, Nov. 9 in the late morning or early afternoon. The exact time will be announced in the Fall *Bulletin*.

Now presented every other year by the Syracuse Stamp Club, SYRAPEX provides a convenient and attractive location for the Society's annual fall meeting. Show hours are 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Saturday and 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Sunday.

The SYRAPEX '03 theme will be the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Wright Brothers first powered flight. There will be a 20-dealer bourse, 48 frames of exhibits, show cancel, youth area and more.

The Society meeting on Sunday will include reports on Society activities, a talk by a Society member on a NY postal history topic, and the annual *Kenneth R. deLisle Award* fourpage exhibit competition (winner determined by vote of those attending the meeting).

In addition to the *deLisle Award* competition, Society members also are urged to enter an exhibit in the SYRAPEX competition. If two or more NY postal history exhibits are entered, ESPHS will award a suitably inscribed Waterford Crystal Timepiece to the best one so long as it receives at least a Show silver.

A Show Prospectus for SYRAPEX '03 can be found at p. 17 of the *Bulletin*, or obtained from Michael Ammann, Syracuse Stamp Club, 217 Inwood Dr., Syracuse, NY 13219-1945.

STEPEX '03, the annual show sponsored by the Elmira Stamp Club, will be held October 17 and 18 at the Arnot Mall in Horseheads, NY, and this, too, provides an excellent venue for beginning as well as experienced postal history exhibitors. It qualifies for the same ESPHS award as SYRAPEX if the same criteria are met.

## REGIONAL MEETING HELD AT BUFFALO SHOW ADA PRILL RECEIVES BUFFPEX ESPHS EXHIBITING AWARD

Our second 2003 regional meeting took place at Buffpex 2003 on Sunday, March 9 at the Sheraton Four Points Hotel (Show venue) in Cheektowaga, NY. Thanks to Buffalo Stamp Club President Rich Cropp, four Society members and two guests had excellent accommodations for the one-hour gathering.

Attending were members Walter Orton, John Cali, Ann Triggle, Al Parsons and guests Rich Cropp and Tim Carey. The meeting was informational only, with Al Parsons describing and updating Society activities and Walter Orton talking about an interesting cover he brought in response to the meeting notice mailed to members in the Buffalo-Niagara-Jamestown area.

As was the case with our regional meeting in Albany Feb.16, a cross-section of Society publications was on display and a number of handouts were available to illustrate the work of the Society, encourage membership, and list those areas where help is needed.

There were three New York postal history exhibits entered at Buffpex 2003: *Buffalo's Transportation Coil - 10-cent Canal Boat* (FDCs; Ray Stone) received a Silver, *Postal History of Clarence* (Display; Ann Triggle) received a Silver, and *Star Cancels of Delaware County, NY* (Ada Prill) received a Gold.

The criteria for a local show having been met, Ada Prill received the ESPHS award, a Waterbury Crystal Timepiece with engravings attached giving the Society's name, the title of the award, the name of the show, the title of the exhibit and the name of the exhibitor.

Ada was not present at Buffpex to receive her award. Fellow RPA member Ray Stone took it with him and later presented it to Ada at a Club meeting.
