Our thanks go to Ernest A. Kehr for his kind letter wishing us well and to Karl Menger for his article.



A favorite cover of mine is perhaps a unique Postmaster cover from Springs, N. Y., a Suffolk County DPO.

Springs of fresh water in the vicinity of Accabonac Harbor were referred to originally as "The Springs" and then as time went on the entire area became known by the same name. Although often called "The Springs" for many years, the first post office established with David D. Parsons as Postmaster, was designated officially as "Springs" (May 15 1849). It would seem that this first post office was located in the older of the two general stores, which, however, at the time of the above letter, February 23 1885, was then owned by Charles K. Smith. The second and younger general store was located somewhat opposite the older one on the other side of the Accabonac River

Ferris G. Talmadge in his "The Springs in the Old Days" recalls a "Wal" Parsons keeping a general store and Post Office, as well as that run by Smith. "Wal" undoubtedly was Walton G. Parsons, one of the sons of Joseph D. Parsons, who died April 5 1885, less than two months after the date of this letter. It is doubtful that his son and successor continued to use his father's postmaster cancelling device. The unknown factor remaining, of course, is the date of its first use.

Talmadge also noted that the mails came from Amagansett in those days. Nate King or the brothers, David and Charles Bennett, at various times carried the mails via the Springs-Amagansett Highway. However, upon the discontinuance of the Springs Post Office, September 29 1923, East Hampton, five miles away, assumed responsibility for delivering the mail to Springs.

Postscript: In the Springs area is a locality called "Fire Place". It derived its name from the fact that for a long time it was the signaling point from which Gardiners Island, three miles away, was notified that supplies for the Island were waiting at the shore. It is not to be confused with another locality by that name on Long Island's south shore with a Post Office from 1802 to 1871. The latter locality is said to have received that name because on its shoreline fires were built to guide whaling boats back through the inlet from the ocean at night.

This stampless cover is a favorite of mine. It's the earliest postally marked item from East Hampton that I've seen-the post office was established October 28 1816 while this letter is dated October 9 1819 and put in the mails two days later.

Adding a bit of interest is the fact that the postmaster re-rated the letter presumably after learning of the enclosure-"enclosed is the deed to the Woods lot". The 181/2 cent rate(Act of April 9 1816, 150 to 400 miles) was thus doubled.

Note that the address stops with "Saratoga County"- no state (N.Y.) named.

In addition to requesting acknowledgment for the deed enclosed, the writer, Abraham Miller, mentions the prevalence of typhus and dysentery and of several resultant deaths. Miller had been East Hampton Town Clerk and Supervisor during the years 1787 to 1803.

The Discontinued Post Offices of Long Island have a special appeal for many collectors.
