

SECRLTARY'S NOTES

The voting on our Constitution and By-Laws has been completed:

34 copies were mailed out with as many ballots.

26 ballots were returned by December 15, 1980.

24 voted to accept the Constitution and By-Laws as written.

2 voted not in favor of acceptance.

Since a quorum (25% of the membership) was achieved and more than two thirds of the of the votes cast were for acceptance, the Constitution and By-Laws are hereby declared accepted as of December 15, 1980. The suggestions of those members not approving will be given consideration.



AN EARLY HUNTINGTON TOWN MARK

The earliest town mark for Huntington, N. Y. listed in the American Stempless Cover Catalog, (Third Edition, 1973) was noted as the circular type in 1842. Under "Miscellaneous Type Fancy Town Fost Marks", a fancy semi-circle, 32mm., in black, is also noted for the period of 1843-44. Prior to this period only town marks in manuscript were reported known.

The above cover may then be considered a discovery. I would have to judge it as an arc with an inner semi-circle, 21mm. "Huntington" is in an arc, 30mm. This town mark with NOR is in red. "N Y" is in manuscript as is the date, "Jany 17", and the rate, "18 3/4", the rate for a single page, 150 to 400 miles, per the Act of March 3, 1825, effective May 1 1825.

Inside this stampless cover, headed Huntington, L. I., Jan 16, 1826, is a bill for \$7.65 to the State of New York for its advertisement (notice of sale of lands for taxes) printed from June 9, 1825 to Jan. 16, 1826 in the American Eagle, Editor H. Herskell.

The American Eagle was Huntington's first newspaper, having been brought from Sag Harbor by Samuel Seabury in 1821. Herman Herskell, a printer with the paper, soon became its editor and finally its proprietor. Shortly after the date of the above letter Herskell sold thepa per to Samuel Fleet in March 1826. Fleet published it as The Portico from March 31, 1826 until February 1827. Until 1838 Huntington was without a newspaper until Walt Whitman began publishing TheLong Islander. The poet was quick to learn that the confining routine of newspaper publishing was not for him and dropped the venture. Shortly thereafter, The Long Islander was taken over by Edward O. Crowell whose first issue of that

weekly was on July 12 1839. and since them not one issue has failed to go to press. Only its publishers and editors have changed in 141 years of reporting Huntington's news.



The two Orient covers illustrated on the cover are a pair of ordinary but attractive looking items of the type that a beginning collector can find at a reasonable cost, i.e. far below the prices realized for the L.I. R.R. covers listed in "Auction Action".

The one bearing a Scott No. 26 has a docketing notation "Augustus Griffin". He is remembered for his Griffin's Journal, memoirs of events and genealogies of Orient.
